ORDINANCE 23- 16

AN ORDINANCE TO CREATE LIMITED PARKING SPOTS ON BUCKEYE STREET IN BELLE CENTER, OHIO

WHEREAS, the Village Council of the Village of Belle Center, Ohio, has the authority pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 723.01 to regulate the use of the streets within the Village, and

WHEREAS, Rostorfer Storage facilities have requested parking spaces to allow loading and unloading along Buckeye Street and,

WHEREAS, the Village Council believes that without proper regulations, the use of Buckeye Street for pedestrians, motorists, and other residents of the Village of Belle Center, Ohio, could be hindered or jeopardized.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Belle Center, Ohio, as follows:

- 1. No one shall park along Buckeye Street within 30 feet of the alley on one end of the storage facility nor within 30 feet of State Street on the other end of the facility.
- 2. Parking shall be permitted between the area not prohibited in number 1 above, namely, between 30 feet from the alley and 30 feet from State Street.
- 3. Parking shall be limited to 30-minute parking and solely for the purposes of loading and unloading and these shall not be parking spaces as are normally designated throughout the Village.
- Parking is only permitted parallel to the storage building and, in a manner, so that the
 vehicle being parked does not protrude onto nor in any way hinder or block the use of
 Buckeye Street by other motorists.
- 5. Any parking done by vehicles with substantial weight shall be responsible in the event the sidewalk is damaged, destroyed, or in need of repair based upon the weight placed upon it by vehicles parking within these designated spots.

It was moved, seconded and passed by a roll call vote of 75% or more of all officials to pass this Ordinance on a single reading and to waive the requirement of three separate readings. Thereafter, it was moved, seconded and passed by a majority vote to enact this Ordinance.

This Ordinance shall become effective as soon as allowable by law.

 An officer, employee, or appointee shall be considered qualified to hold the office or employment, without acquiring a bond, on the date the oath of office is taken, certified, and filed as required by law.
 An officer, employee, or appointee shall have the employee dishonesty and faithful performance of duty policy in effect before the individual's term of office or employment and the officer, employee or appointee shall not commence the discharge of duties until coverage is documented.
 All officers, employees, or appointees who would otherwise be required to file a bond before commencing the discharge of duties shall be covered by and are subject to the employee dishonesty and faithful performance of duty policy instead of a surety bond requirement.
 The coverage amount for an officer, employee, or appointee under an employee dishonesty and faithful performance of duty policy shall be equal to or greater than the maximum amount of the bond otherwise required by law.
5. Elected officials, prior to taking the oath of office and holding office, shall obtain approval of the intent to use the PEP coverage agreement and affirm that the public entities coverage complies with ORC 3.061. Said approval shall be obtained by the VIIIqe of Bellecenter, in

ORDINANCE 23-06

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH THE VILLAGE OF BELLE CENTER, OHIO POLICY PROHIBITING THE USE OF PUBLIC FUNDS FOR POLILTICAL ACTIVITIES

WHEREAS the Ohio Revised Code, under General Provisions, Chapter 9, Subsection 9.03 prohibits the use of public funds for certain political activities, the Village of Belle Center, Ohio, has determined that it shall not and may not use public funds for any of the following purposes:

- 1. Public funds will not be used to compensate any employee of the political subdivision for time spent or any activity to influence the outcome of any election. This does not prohibit compensating an employee for attending a public meeting to present information about the Village of Belle Center's finances, activities or governmental actions in a manner that is not designed to influence the outcome of an election, the passage of a levy, or the passage of a bond issue.
- 2. No public funds shall be utilized to support or oppose any labor organization or any action by or on behalf of or against any labor organization.
- 3. No Village funds shall be used to support or oppose the nomination or election of any candidate for public office, the investigation, prosecution or recall of a public official or the passage of a levy or bond issue.
- 4. No Village funds shall be utilized to benefit any campaign committee, any political action committee, any legislative campaign fund, any political party, any campaign fund, any political committee, any separate segregated fund, or any individual candidate for any elected or appointed position.

This ordinance does not prohibit the utilization of any employee's own time to speak in support of or in opposition to any candidate, recall, referendum, levy, or bond issue unless it is otherwise prohibited by any other section of the Ohio Revised Code.

Nothing in this ordinance prohibits or restricts the Village of Belle Center, Ohio from sponsoring, participating in, or doing any charitable or public service that is not commercial in nature, from advertising, exhibits, performances, programs, products, or services if not otherwise prohibited.

At the regularly scheduled council meeting held in the Village of Belle Center, Ohio, on June 13, 2023, it was moved, seconded, and passed by a vote of at least 75% that this ordinance should pass on a single reading as an emergency measure. Thereafter, it was moved, seconded, and passed by a majority vote that the ordinance should be enacted as an official act of the Village of Belle Center, Ohio.

ORDINANCE 23- OL

- 4. Anyone who violates the no parking provisions shall be guilty of a misdemeanor offense of Illegal Parking and shall be subject to being charged with a minor misdemeanor with a penalty currently up to \$150.00 and as may be changed by action of the legislature.
