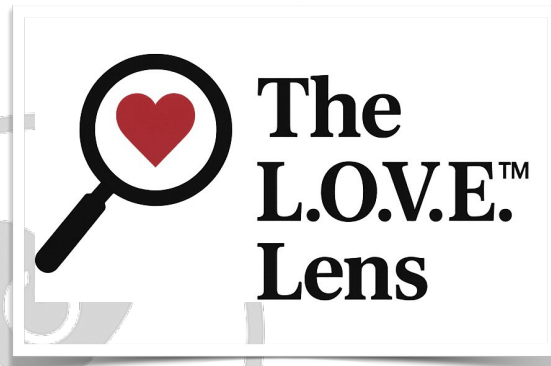
Still Rising: Monthly Reflections

The Heart of Ownership: Heart Posture & Leadership

So often, we judge leaders by what they achieve. Results. Performance. Metrics. But is that really all there is to leadership?

I don't think so.

There is something quieter, yet just as powerful, shaping every outcome: your heart posture.

When you hear the words heart posture, what comes to mind? Emotions? Body language? How you carry yourself? It's deeper than that. It is the underlying attitude that shapes how you show up, how you respond, and how you lead across every area of your life. It influences how you handle pressure, how you treat people, and how you carry your values when no one is applauding at work, at home, and everywhere in between.

Your heart posture should not change just because your surroundings do.

Think of it as the energy you bring into every situation. It shows up when things get uncomfortable and when responsibility lands in your lap. Furthermore, it shows up when you are challenged, corrected, or held accountable.

People feel it in your tone and in your presence, sometimes before you ever say a word.



Before your next conversation, consider how it would feel to be on the other side. Would it come across as respectful, supportive, and empowering?

Take a moment to respond thoughtfully, making sure you stand by your words and how you show up.

This Challenge:

- Reminds leaders to take responsibility for their emotional presence as well as their words.
- Helps leaders avoid reacting impulsively by making time to align before taking action.
- Supports consistency between a leader’s values, actions, and how others experience their leadership.

L.O.V.E.™ Reflection

1. What energy am I consistently bringing into my conversations and interactions?
2. When challenged, do I pause to reflect or react to protect myself?
3. What small shift can I make this week to better align my heart and my impact?

Your true character does not reveal itself when everything is smooth. It is exposed when you are under pressure, stressed, in conflict, and accountability is required.

In the L.O.V.E.™ framework, Ownership is not about control or blame. It is about taking responsibility for your impact. Not just the outcomes, but the experience people have with you along the way.

Many leaders are quick to claim responsibility for positive results. Fewer are willing to own how they show up along the way. Yet that is where real leadership begins.

When your heart posture is aligned, ownership feels steady. Feedback does not feel like an attack. Hard conversations do not unravel you. There is space for correction, clarity, and growth.

When your heart posture is misaligned, everything feels personal. Tone sharpens. Defensiveness creeps in. Trust begins to erode, sometimes so gradually you do not even notice it happening.

Consistency matters.

At work, at home, in the classroom, in your community, or in your place of worship, the way you show up before God should mirror the way you show up everywhere else.

This is not easy work. It requires awareness, humility, and discipline.

Growth is not about perfection. It is about the consistent and continuous work of aligning who you are with the impact you want to have every day.

This is not about being soft. It is about being steady, grounded, and clear.

When you lead with real ownership, anchored in your core values, the path forward becomes clearer, trust strengthens, expectations stabilize, and people know where they stand with you.

Leadership isn't just about what you expect from others. It's about what you are willing to own within yourself, especially when it's your turn to rise up, stand tall, and be better.

And that work begins with your heart posture. Every day.
