Summary: Overall, this vehicle has potential to become showroom quality. There are a few issues that need to be addressed. The main issue would be the rust present on the inner body. There are three rust holes which formed along the years. Its evident in those years the undercarriage has had some rust prevention (Rust coating). The engine does run well and the transmission is in working condition. It did have cold start issues but it resolved after warm ups. The interior has no major issues. During the test drive the clutch was attentive but the gears can be easily mistaken between first and third. It did not slip. Furthermore, for this age of vehicle some rust is expected. This one seems to have more than usual. If this concern can be factored into the price, it would make a great candidate for complete restoration.
