ZATAR FIELDS

milagro tequila, watermelon, perrier, strawberry sashimi, zatar salt

GIN SUNDAY

hendricks, chinola, montenegro

MINT GOLD

fdc12, los sundays coconut, roasted pineapple soda

DIRTY MARIGOLD

reyka vodka, coconut espresso cordial, mr black, espresso

ITALICUS SUMMER

caval reposado, italicus, grapefruit juice, mediterranean tonic

TURMERIC AGUARDIENTE

mezcal, turmeric cordial, mango, aguardiente

WHISKEY TWIST

monkey shoulder, baked apple ginger cordial, nixta elote, mastika

BEET JUICE

sotol, beets

CLASSIC TALES

MARTINI

gin, dry vermouth, orange bitters or large olives

OLD FASHIONED

The first printed definition of the word “cocktail” was back in 1806 and described a combination of sugar, bitters, water, and spirit.

MANHATTAN

This cocktail came into being around the 1880s as a combination of rye whiskey, sweet vermouth and aromatic bitters.

NEGRONI

Created by Count Camillo Negroni, who accidentally swapped the traditional club soda in his Americano with gin.

GIMLET

Believed to have been created by British sailors (as many of the oldest cocktails were) as a way to prevent scurvy.

SAZERAC

Created in the mid-1800s at the Sazerac Coffee House in the storied Crescent City (New Orleans).

TOM COLLINS

Gin, lemon juice, simple syrup, and club soda - a descendant of the gin punches of the 19th century
