





## Croton electric school bus status: May 18 Ballot

- School has put forward 4 transportation-related proposals
  - Proposition 1: two diesel buses and one L3 charger that the School does not need
  - Proposition 2: one 66-passenger electric bus
- All 3 contingent on passage of Proposition 1
- Proposition 3: one 27-passenger electric bus
  Proposition 4: one 27-passenger electric bus
- Croton100 recommends a NO vote on diesel/gas buses and a YES vote on electric buses
- Electric buses are better in all respects
  - Lower Total Cost of Ownership
  - Generous subsidies and New York State aid
  - Better for kids' health due to elimination of particulates
  - Better for global warming due to elimination of CO2





#### Geothermal Ground Source Heat Pump

#### What is a geothermal heat pump?

A central heating and cooling system that uses the temperature of the earth to heat and cool your home. Replacing oil/gas and electrical AC units, this system involved burying pipes on your property to pump refrigerant which is extracted for heating or cooling. In addition to reducing cathon footprint, your Croton neighbors are saving money each year on heating and cooling bills by making this upgrade. Video Source: US Department of Energy





#### Meet your neighbor!

Sheryl Goldberg of Croton-on-Hudson installed a ground source heat pump in May 2019.

#### What inspired you to make this upgrade?

Our oil burner was due for an upgrade, and I could not bring myself to committing to 20 + years of burning fossil fuels. After examining the list of home improvement projects that we were facing, we decided to put those that would have a high "Global Citizen Score" and save us money (after the initial investment) at the top of the list.
