




How to join the videoconference












Croton School Bus Status

Cost of gas bus = \$120,000

Cost of electric bus = \$346,650 NY Truck Voucher Incentive Program = (\$120,000) Special Volkswagen settlement funding = (\$80,000) Effective cost of electric bus = \$146,650

Note:

- Bus is available and can be shipped at short notice
- Electric bus saves money on fuel and maintenance
- The \$80,000 opportunity will go away after September 30, 2020
- Tarrytown is getting one or more electric buses this cycle!

Letter Writing Campaign

Excerpts from Croton100 Board's letter to the editor of the Croton Gazette:

Consider this: the gas bus that the School intends to buy costs \$120,000 while the electric bus which meets all requirements and is readily available would cost \$146,650 after subsidies. Not only is the difference in cost quite small, but lower maintenance and fuel costs will quickly recover the additional investment. Thus, financial considerations favor the electric bus!

We the board members of Croton100 stand by to facilitate the \$200,000 of funding, for which the School needs to apply by September 30, 2020. Time is of the essence! Five letters have been written to the Board of Education so far in response to our letter to the editor of the Gazette... let's get 95 more!

"Repower" Option for Electric School Buses

- Hen Hud school district does not have a model year 1992 to 2009 diesel bus to scrap, hence they are not eligible for NYTVIP
- However, NYSERDA has a voucher program for <u>repowering buses 6 years or more old</u> (with good body integrity)
- The diesel motor is replaced by a battery and electric motor
- Cost of retrofit = \$170,000
- Voucher from NYSERDA = \$136,000
- Cost to school district = \$34,000 (+ charging infrastructure)
- Range up to 100 miles
- Some details
 - Bus is grandfathered on safety requirements, cost above does not include safety retrofits, cameras, ramps, etc.
 - Bus will have heating and A/C
 - Retrofit can be performed in ~9 weeks
 - All the benefits of an electric bus including savings on fuel cost, savings on maintenance, better driver experience, zero emissions, etc.

CURE100 Launch Status



Legal status:

- Renaming Croton100 as CURE100 underway (<u>Communities <u>U</u>nited to <u>Reduce Emissions <u>100</u>%)
 </u></u>
- That will also create a new structure allowing chapters to operate under CURE100 guidance
- IRS group exemption was taken off the table by Trump administration this summer
- So we have to take a new approach of CURE100 being the sole tax-exempt body
- Tax-exempt fundraising by chapters will have to flow to CURE100 for redistribution
- New, simple Bilateral Sponsorship Agreement (BSA) between CURE100 and chapters

Licensing:

- New, simpler Software Licensing Agreement for licensing the Carbon Tracker App coming soon
- This Software as a Service (SaaS) license will include (1) a front-end service agreement with the chapter or pre-existing non-profit or local government and (2) a "click through" End User License Agreement for the actual households who register.
- Viral sales enabled: each licensee will be authorized to offer any other eligible group a license.
 To activate the license, each applicant will register an account with CURE100 to obtain the needed credentials.

Carbon Tracker Update

- New app in development addresses all the feedback received to date
- **Community tracking** will be enabled (all users entering through your portal will be aggregated data, sortable by entry point "community")
- My Carbon "future tracking" capability will allow users to enter future changes (new EV, change of diet, updating HVAC, etc.,) and see impact on carbon emission over 20 years
- All zip codes accessible: App will work for all zip codes (42,000) in the US. We have compute and uploaded base emissions data for every zip code in the US.
- Rollout of new version of Carbon Tracker due in October 2020 in conjunction with CURE100 launch!
