2. Introduction to Radiotherapy Networks



Why Networks?

Radiotherapy Networks (previously known as Radiotherapy Operational Delivery Networks) were commissioned by NHS England in 2019 as one of several ODNs including Spinal, Neurosurgery and Trauma Networks.

Radiotherapy Networks are designed to improve outcomes for Service Users, including higher cure rates and fewer side effects from treatments. To do this they need to 'facilitate meaningful partnership working between key organisations, personnel, and professional groups within the health system to secure quality and service improvement, adopt technical innovation, ensure access to new treatments and clinical trials and unlock efficiencies'.



Network Aims


- Improve access across the Network to modern, advanced, and innovative radiotherapy techniques, enabling more Service Users to benefit from cutting-edge technology and treatments.
- Improve the experience of care by ensuring Service Users will be managed by an experienced multiprofessional tumour specific subspecialist team able to provide holistic care.
- Increase participation in research and clinical trials by an average of 15% increase over 3 years in England, aiding faster development of new treatments and help drive the development of clinical services.
- Reduce variation in quality by adopting best practice protocols thereby improving Service User outcomes
 including reducing mortality and morbidity from adverse side effects.
- Plan and co-ordinate the incorporation of new and innovative technologies into local services for example, ProKnow and Al solutions.



Network Aims


- Review service provision on a regular basis to ensure optimal access arrangements for Service Users are in
 place across the Network. This applies to proposals relating to sub-specialisation, expansion, or re-provision
 of a service, the development of satellite service facilities and equipment replacement, because such
 facilities will need to demonstrate effective equipment utilization and financial viability. This will involve
 working with ICSs to access system operational capital and undertaking capacity and demand activities
 locally across the Network.
- Using benchmarking data and guidance from equipment manufacturers about throughput, take action to
 reduce variation in equipment utilisation, subject to workforce availability. This could be achieved by
 changing operating arrangements, clinical practice, and, in some cases, equipment replacement.
- Undertake local workforce planning activities; ensuring a joined-up workforce through skills development and approaches that enable people to work at the 'top of their license' and recruit and train for the future.
- Undertake activities to ensure compliance with national waiting time standards for radiotherapy.

Additional Network Funding

Service Development Funding: National Cancer Programme of Care

Service Development Funding is awarded by the National Cancer Programme of Care team to Networks. For 2025/26 this will be awarded to those plans that support cancer wait improvements. This aligns with Government priorities.

Improvement in cancer waits requires productivity gains through:

- The way people work processes and workforce change
- Delivering the best quality care e.g., maximising technology; Quality Improvement Toolkit findings; implementation of best practice; and streamlined pathways.

We are waiting for confirmation on the amount of funding that will be made available. Once this is received NOG members will be invited to submit proposals. These applications will be prioritised as follows:

- 1. Priority will be given to projects that would equally benefit all radiotherapy departments within the Network.
- 2. This will be followed by individual eligible projects that will benefit one radiotherapy department specifically.

These proposals must clearly state how outputs will demonstrate an improvement in cancer waits as outlined above. It must be possible to deliver these outputs by 31st March 2026 to be eligible for the funding.

Roles and Responsibilities of the NOG

Specifically, and in summary, the NOG is responsible for:

- i. Facilitating meaningful partnership work.
- ii. Producing and overseeing the delivery of a programme of work (Work Programme).
- iii. Coordinating any public involvement duties, with the support of the regional Specialised Commissioning team.
- iv. Preparing an annual report for submission to commissioners outlining performance and improvement in the network.
- v. In conjunction with the East of England's Cancer Alliance and Specialised Commissioning team, reviewing service provision on a regular basis to ensure optimal access arrangements.

A work programme will be developed by the NOG and will require approval of the constituent providers, the East of England Cancer Alliances and Specialised Commissioning teams. The work programme must be consistent with the requirements of the radiotherapy specifications.



Roles and Responsibilities of the NOG

The EofE RTN exists to improve the quality of care available to patients within the geography of the East of England. It will achieve this by:

- ensuring that there is equity of access to a comprehensive range of services across the network regardless of geography.
- ensuring that care is provided seamlessly across the network and its various stages of transition (between locations, services and where there are co-morbidities)
- ensuring that high quality care is delivered by participating providers which meet the requirements of NHS England's service specification and other nationally agreed standards and addressing unwarranted variation.
- ensuring service capacity meets demand, including predicting demand and developing systems to collectively manage capacity
 in response to demand including at times of surge or emergencies.
- ensuring the provision of high-quality information for patients, families, staff and commissioners is supported.
- creating a culture of collaboration and action to continually improve services with a strong, collective voice for network stakeholders including patients and their families who use these services.
- taking responsibility, through the management of the network team, for the development of an effective operating structure for the Network including robust governance, risk and monitoring arrangements.


