



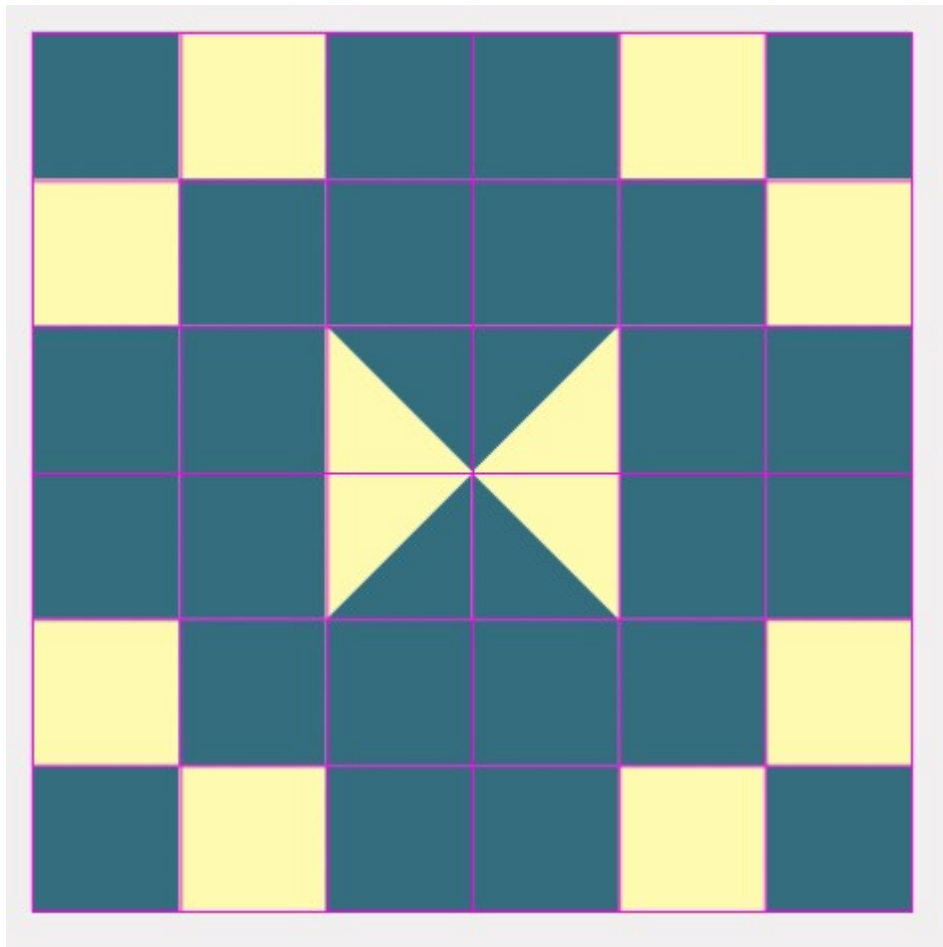
Round Robin Scrappy Quilt Series episodes 126-131

Instructions will show working from the centre block out in rounds, follow the video series for assembly instructions. This information is compiled from my sample quilt to the best of my ability using various fabrics from my scraps, therefore yardage is not available.

Block One; The Center episode 126 (dark version)
Measures 12.5” x 12.5” unfinished

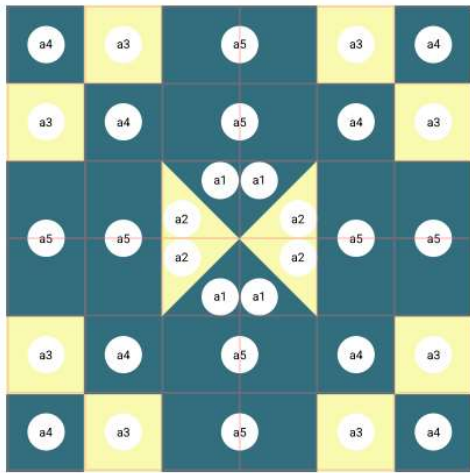


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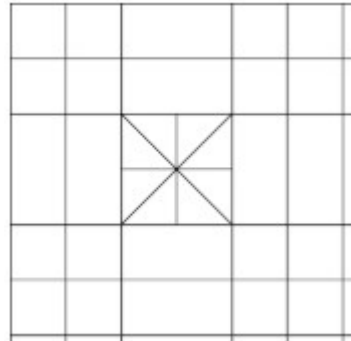
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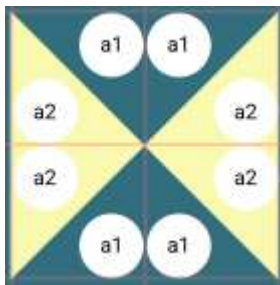

Quantity 4 Half Square Triangles (Or use 2 Flying Geese that measure 2.5 x 4.5” unfinished), For the Half square triangles I prefer to oversize and start with 3.5” squares, these instructions follow the standard measures that most charts use.

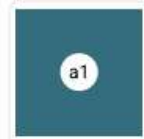

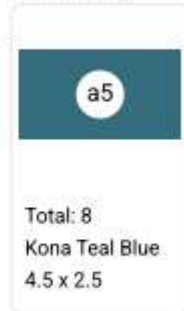
2 Patches:

Total 4 units required using 8 @ 2.5 x 4.5” dark fabric potato chips

Join 2 together making a unit that measures 4.5 x 4.5” unfinished **or** use a quantity of 4 that measure 4.5 x 4.5”

Assemble per the Video

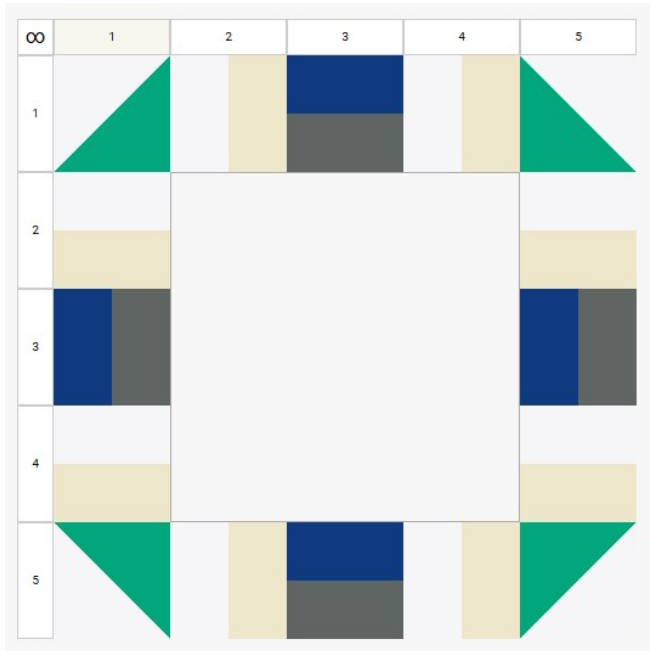
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Part 2 – Round 1 Episode 127:

20.5 x 20.5” unfinished



Dark Fabric Units using 2 at 2.5 x 4.5 for each unit OR use 1 at 4.5” square

Total required 4 units



Light Fabric Units using 2 at 2.5 x 4.5 for each unit OR use 1 at 4.5” square

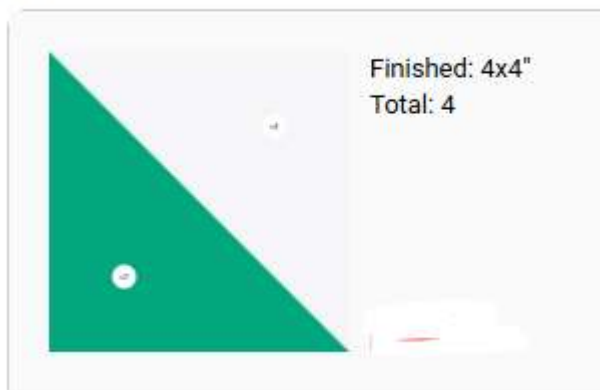

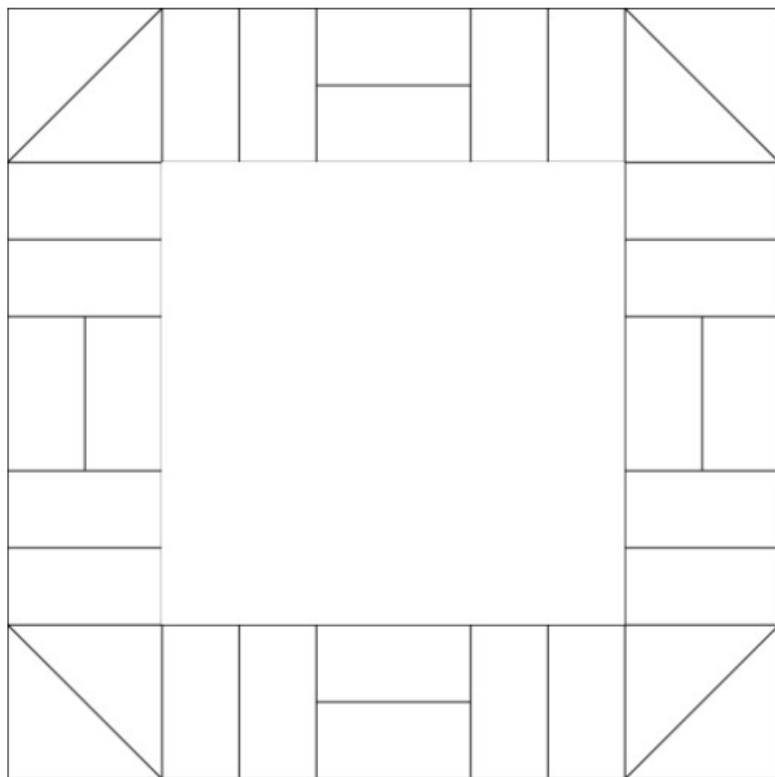

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Part 3 – Round 2

Episode 128:

24.5 x 28.5” unfinished This border now creates a vertical format



UNIT ONE:

Make 4 with light fabric as the inside and dark fabric as the corners and side strip:

The easiest way to make these corner units are to use 4 Half Square Triangles (HST) (or 2 Flying Geese) per unit that measure 4.5 x 4.5 unfinished when assembled. Each HST would need to measure 2.5” unfinished and then joined as below. OR take a 4.5” light fabric and add flip and stitch 2.5” squares to each corner.

Once you have the unit made add a 2.5 x 4.5” to the right hand side.

These units should measure 6.5 x 4.5” unfinished

Custom Corner



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Centre Top and Bottom Units;

Make 4, Two for the top row and Two for the bottom row

These units should measure 4.5” unfinished

I created a Foundation Paper Pieced template for consistency, but you can also use two Half Square Triangles per unit—just like making an Hour Glass block, except replace one half with two solid dark fabrics.

Once done, then add an On Point Unit that is dark in the centre with light outside

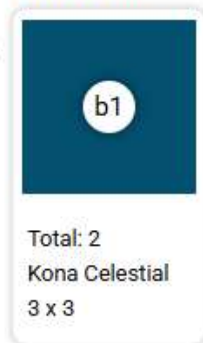

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The Top and Bottom Rows can be assembled, one for the top row and one for the bottom row. Each should measure 24.5 x 4.5” unfinished :



For each side join together 5 at 2.5 x 4.5” in dark fabric (or use a continuous strip measuring 20.5 x 2.5”
Make TWO and add one to each side (on the left side and on the right side).

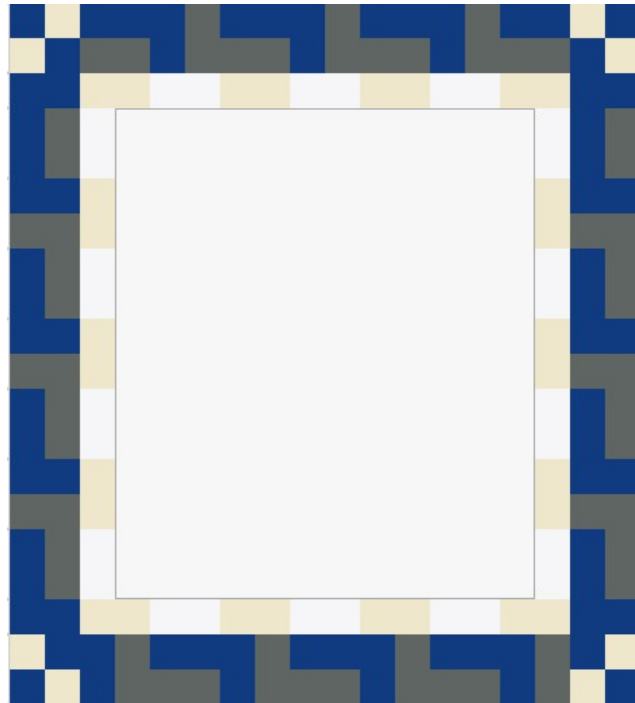
Add the top and bottom rows, to this unit which should now measure 24.5 x 28.5” unfinished

Part 3 is now complete:

PART 4: This round adds to borders and helps to frame the center design

Will measure 36.5 x 40” unfinished.

This would make a nice size lap or baby quilt if you decided to stop at this size

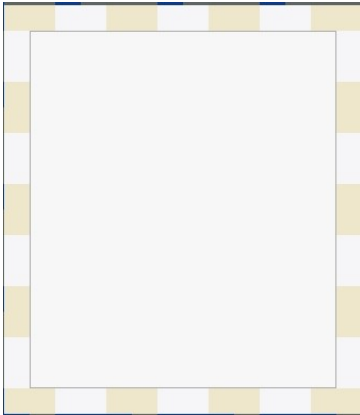


Inside Border:

This should be an easy assembly, collect 28 light fabric pieces that measure 2.5 x 4.5” OR if you choose to use continuous strips then use the following grid:

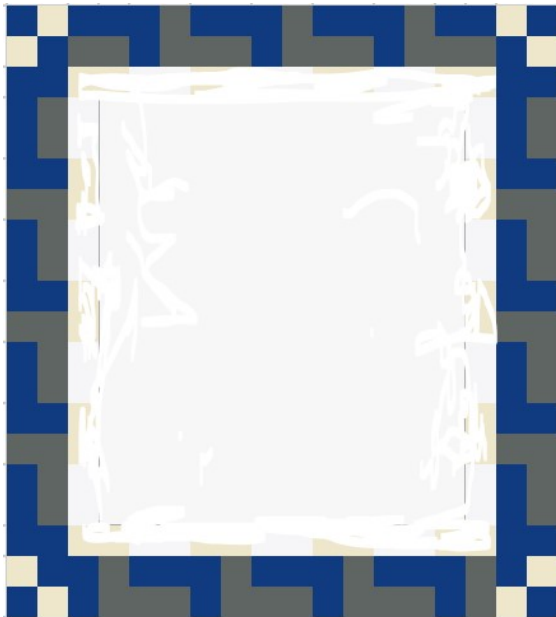
Each side uses continuous strips measuring 2.5 x 31.5”
or a qty of 7 at 2.5 x 4.5” Piece end to end to equal 31.5”

Add one strip to the left hand side and add one strip to the right hand side.



For the top and bottom portion of the border
Repeat the same using the remaining 14 at 2.5 x 4.5” to create two strips each measuring 2.5 x 31.5” (or use two continuous 2.5” strips if you desire).

Add one strip to the top and one strip to the bottom, these insider border should now be complete.



Outside borders:

Sides:

Make 2 one for each side

Working on the two sides first, using 16 (per side) pieces of darker fabric in the same color family (mine are dark blues/grays) pair 14 together to create 4.5” blocks, join these ends to end staggering the seams (one set vertical, one set horizontal, then vertical etc.) once pieced as a continuous ribbon, take one single 2.5 x 4.5” and add to each end. Add one complete side to the left and one to the right side.

Top and Bottom Rows:

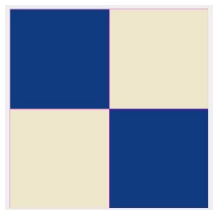
Using 14 (per row) pieces of darker fabric in the same color family pair 14 together to create 4.5” blocks, join these end to end staggering the seams (same layout as the sides). Make two and put aside to join with the 4-patch blocks.



4 Patch Blocks:

Use qty of 8 at 2.5” square light fabric and qty of 8 at 2.5” square dark fabric

Create 4 units of 4-patch blocks, each should measure 4.5” square unfinished



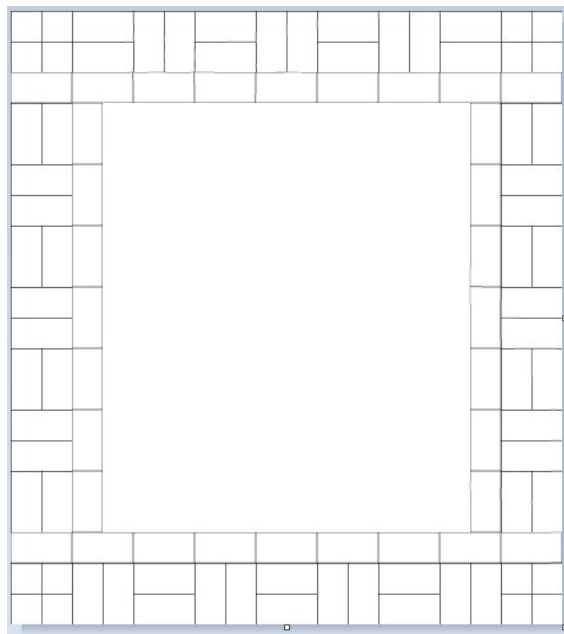
Join One 4 Patch Unit onto the end of each row, it should look like this



Note the orientation of the dark part of the 4=patch as this helps to create the secondary pattern in the finished quilt.

Add both rows, one to the bottom and one to the top, this completes these two borders.

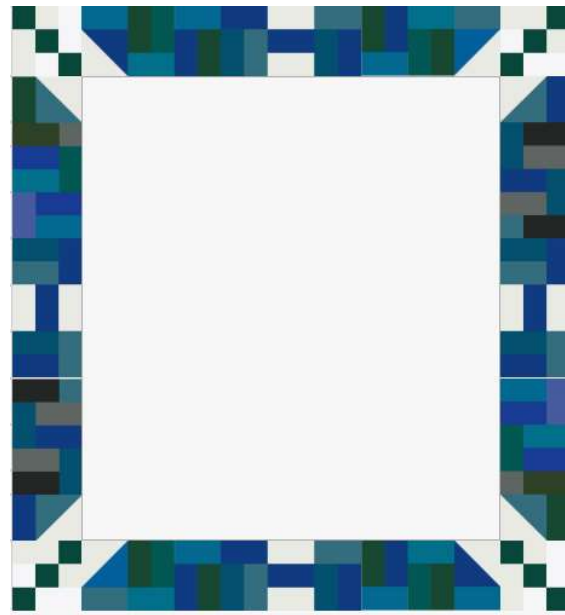
Here is a coloring page and reference for the unit placement



PART 4 is now complete and should measure 36.5 x 40.5” Unfinished



PART 5: Adding another round or borders which also adds another 6” to each side



These borders are made using 4 units, I will show you here how to make those first.

9-patch units Unit A :



They are called a 9-patch BUT they are constructed using a light and dark fabric 4-patch and then adding 2 at 2.5 x 4.5” light fabric strips and one additional square. So for each unit you will need

- 3 at 2.5” squares in dark fabric
- 2 at 2.5” squares in a light fabric and
- 2 at 2.5” x 4.5” strips

Construct the 4-patch first, then add following the video (and illustration below):



These two sub units are joined together forming a 9-patch looking block. Bonus is using up more potato chip strips.

Make four each should measure 6.5 x 6.5” unfinished

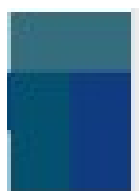


HST Units B: Make 8 To measure 4.5 x 6.5” unfinished

Each unit should use a 4.5” Half Square Triangle (dark.light fabric) with a 2.5 x 4.5” dark fabric potato chip strip added:



3 Strip Units C: Make 24 using all dark fabric each unit uses 3 at 2.5 x 4.5” strips, will measure 4.5 x 6.5” unfinished



2-piece Unit D: Make 4, these will be used on the two sides. Each unit uses 1 at 2.5 x 4.5 strip and a 2.5” square both in dark fabric will measure 2.5 x 6.5” unfinished



3 Piece Unit E (light version): Make 4, these will be used on each border side, Each unit uses 2 at 2.5 x 4.5” lighter fabric strips and 1 2.5 x 4.5: darker fabric potato chip strip.



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Now to assemble all of the units to complete the borders. Starting with the sides working from the left bottom and up assemble in the following order:

UNIT B, C,C,C,D,E,D,C,C,C,B, paying attention to the orientation of the Unit Bs so that they face the correct way. Make 2 and add to the existing project, one on the left and one on the right-hand side



For the top and bottom rows, join blocks in this order working from left to right A, B, C,C,C,E,C,C,C,B,A (there are no D's in these two rows). Make 2



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Join to the main quilt top paying attention to which way the rows face (the white HST face in). The quilt top should measure 48.5 x 52.5”unfinished



PART 6: The final round, found in YouTube Episode 131

Side inside borders:

Light Fabric strips 1-1/2 x 52.5” – I used various lengths and joined end to end to equal 52.5”. Make 2 and add to both the left and right sides of your quilt top

Top and Bottom Rows:

Light Fabric strips 1-1/2” by 50.5” *** (I used various lengths to join end to end to equal 50.5”); join these strips to the top and bottom of your quilt top *** measure your quilt top to check your measurements

Top and Bottom Rows: next border

Dark Fabric in 4.5 x 2.5” strips, join 13 end to end to make a strip and add to both the top and bottom rows ** adjust your length, if needed by trimming or adding more fabric, before adding to your quilt top

Side outside borders:

Make 2:

For each last side borders, join in this order

1 light fabric 2.5” square, 64.5” strip of 2.5” wide fabric, then 1 light fabric 2.5” square *** (join strips together to equal your measurement. **** Measure YOUR quilt top first, as your piecing may differ



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OPTIONAL:

Make 2 – as shown in final quilt top

Add a dark 3” strip to the top and bottom rows approximately 58.5” in length – piece strips to make the right width for your quilt top **

When adding outside borders, it is critical to measure in three places to average the distance for fabric length. If you just add on and trim off the excess, you run the risk of a wavy border. These measurements are based on my quilt top and math, your ¼” may be larger or scanner than mine.

My unfinished size is 54.5 x 66.5
