

- Financial reports-Tony -- September and October's, Tony reported that the numbers in Liabilities and Equity were accounting totals that Professional Accounting needed to use to reconcile and several of the totals included numbers from the beginning of time when they started posting our accounts. The fact that a few of the numbers were the same was coincidental.
