

DID YOU KNOW: If you are over 73 you must take “Required Minimum Distributions” (RMD’s) from your tax-deferred account (IRA, 401 K, retirement plans, etc.). Donations to the church from your RMD help the mission of the church and can reduce your taxes. RMD’s are taxed as income and can push you into a higher income tax bracket. However, qualified charitable contributions given directly from your retirement account to the church are not taxed and can “count” as part or all of your RMD. You can use this strategy even if you use the standard deductions for your income taxes.
