CTING icon James Stewart, who embodied the best of American morality in It's a **Wonderful Life and Mr. Smith** Goes to Washington, kept a potentially career-ending secret to the end of his days — he was a horndog who bedded half of Hollywood, including Loretta Young, Olivia de Havilland, Ginger Rogers, Lana Turner, Norma Shearer and Kim Novak. He even put the screws to Marlene Dietrich to abort his illegitimate baby!

That's just one of the juicy insider tidbits in a new book exposing the good, the bad and the ugly secrets the stars went to great lengths to protect so they could enjoy their fame AND privacy!

Author Salah Bachir who leads a "rock star life" according to pal Elton John — spent decades cultivating famous people.

"We bonded over our shared passion for raising money for good causes and developed lifelong friendships," says the 67-year-old Canadian philanthropist and art collector, who dishes on 50 celeb pals in First to Leave the Party: My **Life with Ordinary People Who** Happen to Be Famous, which debuts Oct. 17.

When Bachir came to **Elizabeth Taylor's Toronto hotel** to fetch her for a fundraiser she was top-lining, he found

her "huddled on the sofa in a fur coat," unable to leave her suite because caustic comic Joan Rivers kept humiliating the two-time Oscar winner about her weight.

"I don't look good enough," the violet-eyed beauty lamented.

La Liz was so desperate to avoid ridicule and unflattering photos, she disquised herself in scarves and dowdy clothes to shop at antiques markets.

Other stars who longed to avoid the fuss of fame included acting royalty **Paul Newman and Joanne Woodward**, who often stopped by Bachir's pad for a latenight bite. The down-to-earth couple refused to drink bottled water, only tap, and on a road trip to Niagara Falls insisted on buying fast-food burgers to repay franchises for using their restrooms!

Bachir says he liked helping great actors and directors who were down on their luck or health.

"I met many of them at the end of their careers," he tells The National ENQUIRER. "Some of the biggest stars couldn't get work because Hollywood judged their talent by the pound.

"Or take the case of the great actress Patricia Neal, who costarred with Newman in Hud. She played the mother in the movie version of The Waltons. which touted homespun family



Closeted gay stars were particularly fearful about being outed. Liberace publicly denied he was gay to the bitter end, but the blingtastic entertainer kept his hand on the author's knee during a breakfast in Las Vegas while confessing to hiding in plain sight: "They all know what they're seeing,"

And MGM put screen and stage star Van Johnson in war pictures to make him look "manly," but the gay actor struggled with leading a double life and often played grab-ass with such unreceptive victims as Schitt's Creek star Eugene Levy.
