

NLIA Meeting Minutes

October 14th, 2025

Opening: Meeting called to order by Renee Osborn at 6:30pm

Approval of the Last Meeting Minutes: Approved September 2025 meeting minutes.

Guest Speakers: Kelly Smith, Anne Arundel County District 1 Candidate.

Topics of Discussion/Report from Board:

- Mrs. Kathy's wall- Vincent Moulden from AA County reaching out to State Highway Administration Project Manager to request an update on this project and to the Maryland Department of the Environment, Environmental Justice team. Mrs. Kathy received an email reply back stating the project is in the design phase and there is only funding for design, no money anytime soon to proceed past the design phase. Mrs. Kathy asked Ms. Wotring if children attending Overlook can write letters and send to the county regarding the noise outside of the school during outside time. Also asked attendees of the meeting to email any questions, she would like a representative to attend the February 2026 meeting if we get enough questions.
- Per Vincent Moulden from AA County- Governors Gate/Charles Road re-evaluation for a 4-way stop will be done at the end of 2025.
- Upcoming events-October 18th-Friendship Church of the Brethren Fall Festival 10:00am to 2:00pm, October 21st, 2025 6:00pm-8:00pm Trunk-or-Treat at Lindale Middle School. There will be no Spooktacular this year. North Linthicum Tree Lighting at Friendship Church of the Brethren will be Sunday, November 30th at 4:45pm. The church will be collecting socks and mittens for their annual sock and mitten tree.
- Board requested a speed camera on Nursery Road between Sarah Avenue and Patapsco Road-no response back as of this meeting.
- Permit request was submitted to shut down Charles Road between Hampton Road and Colonial Drive on Halloween night from 6-8pm to help slow down traffic. Renee worked with Karley Emrich to submit the request. The request is currently pending.
- Collin Alexander to attend community meeting at Northern Precinct on October 21st on behalf of NLIA to discuss Boss Moves store on Nursery Road. The store is advertised as a hair braiding store, but they are selling all kinds of randomness inside and out into the parking lot. Renee also spoke with Corporal Giunta who advises North Linthicum residents to report dirt bikes and any other suspicious activity by either calling 911 or calling the non-emergency number at 410-222-8610.
- Shannon spoke with AA County Waste Management regarding their Community Clean-Up program. North Linthicum has been added to their list to receive a community

dumpster to be placed for two days at a central location (most likely at the park). Someone will reach out to NLIA in February to schedule a date for the dumpster drop off for spring/summer 2026.

- Letter of support for Colonial Drive sidewalk proposal #2 was sent to Blake Lightcap, Project Engineer with AA County Department of Public Works on behalf of NLIA. Blake responded back on 9/25/25 that AA county might not have sufficient ROW to reconstruct the existing sidewalk along Colonial Drive. He has requested that ROW be staked in the field so that further options can be evaluated. There are no estimates of when this will be completed and he will reach back once he has more information.
- Renee working with Amy Salmon with Allstate Insurance on obtaining liability insurance so that we can continue NLIA events in the future. The 1st quote that was provided was \$315/year (\$26.25 per month). The quote is for both general liability coverage \$1 million/@4 million and \$10K property coverage for the signs, etc. Amy had to reach out to underwriters, so this quote is not final.
- Wall Ball Court at the park. Parks and Rec said they can tear down the wall ball court and make it a pickle ball court. This option was presented to meeting attendees and it was determined this is not what the community would like, children still use the wall ball court. Community would like to have another mural painted, going to try to see if we can find someone in the community who would like to paint the mural. The design would need to be approved by Parks & Rec, aiming for this to be approved and painted in the spring. The graffiti was painted over immediately after it was reported to Parks & Rec.
- Treasurer report: \$3,123.52 in checking, \$10,418.28 in savings, and \$1.16 in grant funding
