#### 1 RULES

1.1 The regattas and series will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (see <a href="https://www.sailing.org/tools/documents/WSRRS20212024FinalwithChgsandCorrecns201113-[26798].pdf">https://www.sailing.org/tools/documents/WSRRS20212024FinalwithChgsandCorrecns201113-[26798].pdf</a>) with US Sailing Prescriptions (see <a href="https://cdn.ussailing.org/wp-content/uploads/2020/11/2021-2024-US-Prescriptions-Final.pdf">https://cdn.ussailing.org/wp-content/uploads/2020/11/2021-2024-US-Prescriptions-Final.pdf</a>) and the rules of the International Sunfish Class Association (see

<u>https://www.sunfishclass.org/about/rules-measurement</u>), except as modified by this Notice and the Sailing Instructions.

## 2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 The regattas and series are open to all boats of the Sunfish class.
- 2.2 Eligible boats may enter by completing the 2021 membership form and sending it, together with the required fee, to the Greater Detroit Sunfish Club Treasurer by May 1. Entry shall include designating fleet(s) of intended competition: Senior Gold; Senior Blue; Ladies, Junior.
- 2.3 All persons involved in club activities must have an annual waiver on file with the GDSC Logkeeper prior to participation in any club activity.
- 2.4 Late entries will be accepted under the following conditions: completed form and payment submitted prior to starting the first race.
- 2.5 Ladies and Juniors may compete in Senior fleet races.

#### 3. FLEET DESIGNATION

- 3.1 Senior Gold Fleet shall be comprised of experienced racers.
- 3.2 Senior Blue Fleet shall be comprised of developing and novice racers.
- 3.3 Ladies Fleet shall be comprised of all ladies regardless of age or experience.
- 3.4 Junior Fleet shall be comprised of all sailors not reaching the age of 19 by the end of 2021.
- 3.5 Any club member may move up to a higher fleet by advising the Race Committee Chairman (no going backwards). His or her prior fleet standings may be considered for season standings.
- 3.6 New skippers may be assigned to the Gold Fleet by the Race Committee.

#### 3 FEES

3.1 Active Membership - \$40 individual dues (\$45 after April 15)

Family Membership – \$65 dues-2 or more boats from same household (\$70 after April 15)

Late-season Membership - \$20 dues per individual after July 15 (New members ONLY)

Associate Members - \$10 dues (Non sailing members)

Open Regatta Registration Fee (non-members) - \$20 individual entry fee (registration and waiver required)

Introductory Event – Free (registration and waiver required, one day only)

Regatta Host Family Membership – Fees waived in acknowledgement

On single dates no warning signal will be made after 4:00 pm.

On the first day of a regatta no warning signal will be made after 4:00 pm.

On the second day of a regatta no warning signal will be made after 3:00 pm.

## 4.2 Number of races:

There shall be three Senior fleet races minimum per day, a Ladies fleet race, and a Junior fleet race. The Ladies race and/or Junior race may be combined into a Senior race. By agreement of those present, additional races may be held on any given race day.

#### 5 QUALIFYING

To qualify for the season awards a sailor shall compete in one less than 50% of the races sailed.

#### **6** MEASUREMENT

6.1 Each boat shall be in compliance with the rules of the International Sunfish Class Association.

## 7 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions follow this document.

#### 8 THE COURSES

The courses will be windward –leeward, triangles, or combinations thereof.

#### 9 PENALTIES

- 9.1 US Sailing Prescription Appendix V is in effect.
- 9.2 Team racing during singles competition is cause for disqualification by the Race Committee (team racing is 2 boats racing as a team).

#### 10. CONDUCT OF RACES

- 10.1 The Race Committee is responsible for conducting races.
- The Race Committee chairman is responsible for making the final decision in the conduct of races, consulting the Race Committee Chair or club officers when appropriate.
- 10.3 Members of the Race Committee and those assisting (including the people in the Race Committee boat) are expected to make prompt, independent decisions in emergency situations involving safety.
- 10.4 Normal Starting sequence is as follows (in accordance with RRS 26):

- 10.5 Individual Recall signal is verbal with one additional sound signal.
- 10.6 General Recall signal is two additional sound signals.
- 10.7 Official finishing is by sail number called out by Race Committee.
- Skippers officially enter a race by signing up on the race sheet prior to the race. The race sheet is used to score results, so please abide by the following: Be sure you are signed up for the race in the proper fleet with the proper sail number. If you are signed up but don't race, notify the Race Committee immediately after the race. If you do not finish or disqualify yourself, notify the Race Committee immediately.
- 10.9 Protests notify the Race Committee immediately after finishing. Fill out a club protest form on shore and submit it to the Protest Chairman for determination.
- 10.10 Only club members present at the time of the race will have their results count toward any sailing awards.

#### 11. RACE COMMITTEE BOAT DUTY

- 11.1 Race is run from the Race Committee boat which is to be operated by a minimum of 1 capable Senior.
- 11.2 Due to the small size of the club, the sailors in each fleet will be assigned one or more Race Committee boat duties. He/she will be awarded 3 points for the race and a "Did Not Compete" (DNC) for other races. One committee boat duty in a Senior race is minimum to be eligible for season awards. The Race Committee Chairman will assign skippers for Race Committee boat duty in advance. List of assignments will be published in advance. If you are assigned and cannot be present, obtain a substitute and notify the Race Committee Chairman prior to your assigned race day. The Race Committee may assign appropriate penalties for failure to fulfill assigned Race Committee boat duty.
- 11.3 Race Committee boat duty will count as the average of the days' races in the Travelers Trophy series as well as for regatta awards.

#### 12 SCORING

12.1 The scoring system is as follows:

Low point system: First = 1 point, Second = 2 points, Third = 3 points, Fourth = 4 points, etc.

Did not compete (DNC): points = number of boats registered for race plus 10.

Did not finish (DNF): points = number of boats registered for race plus 1.

Disqualified (DSQ): points = number of boats registered for race plus 1.

Show but no race due to weather: 10 points (applies to Senior fleets only).

Scheduled race-no show: Did Not Compete (DNC), see points above.

#### 12.2 Ties

Ties will be decided as follows (in sequence):

Skipper with most firsts, seconds, thirds, etc. wins. If still tied, whichever skipper beat the other the most times, only races in which both skippers raced are used. If still tied, whichever boat beat the other in the most recent race of the day, series, or season.

12.3 Season Scoring:

Senior Fleets: Minimum 27 races scheduled (9 separate race days) - count the best 13 races.

Examples: 27 races - count 13; 13 races - count 13; 6 races count 13.

Ladies: 9 races scheduled - count best of one less than half of the races sailed (maximum of 4).

Examples: 9 races - count 4; 4 races - count 4; 2 races - count 4.

Juniors: 9 races scheduled – count best of one less than half of the races sailed (maximum of 4).

Examples: 9 races - count 4; 4 races - count 4; 2 races - count 4.

Travelers Trophy Series Trophies: Holiday Open Regattas scores combined for Club Members Only. Senior Fleet:

2 throw-outs if 12 or more races raced.

1 throw-out if 6 or more races but less than 12.

0 throw-outs if 5 or less races raced.

Junior Fleet: Count best 3 races. Ladies Fleet: Count best 3 races.

- 12.4 Twelve Senior Fleet, 5 Ladies Fleet and/or 5 Junior Fleet races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 12.5 Scoring will be determined by skipper name only, regardless of boat used for all events all races. No skipper may substitute for another.

12.6 Races will be held regardless of the number of boats – all fleets. In no wind or unsafe conditions, the Race Committee can cancel racing. Decision to be made at the sailing venue.

## 13 RADIO COMMUNICATION

Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

#### 1 RULES

- 1.2 Appendix P shall not apply.
- 1.3 Competitors shall wear a properly secured personal flotation device at all times while afloat, except briefly while changing clothes. US competitors must wear USCG approved PFDs.

#### 2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

2.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located at the Fleet Captain's vehicle or announced location.

## 3 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 3.1 Changes to the sailing instructions will be posted before 1000 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect. This may be done by email.
- 3.2 Oral changes may be given only on the water and shall be communicated to each boat before her warning signal.

#### 4.2 Number of races:

There shall be three Senior races minimum per day, a Ladies race, and a Junior race. The Ladies race and/or Junior race may be combined into a Senior race. By agreement of those present, additional races may be held on any given race day.

- 4.3 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race on single dates is 12:30 p.m. except at Les Cheneaux Yacht Club; the scheduled time there is 10:00 a.m.
  - The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race on regatta dates is 10:30 a.m.
- 4.4 On single dates no warning signal will be made after 4:00 p.m.
  - On the first day of a regatta no warning signal will be made after 4:00 p.m.
  - On the second day of a regatta no warning signal will be made after 3:30 p.m.

#### 5 THE COURSES

The courses will be windward–leeward, triangles, or combinations thereof.

#### 6 MARKS

6.1 The marks will be orange balls.

#### 7 THE START

- 7.1 Races will be started by using RRS 26 with the warning signal made five minutes before the starting signal.
- 7.2 The starting line will be between the staff on the Race Committee boat and a buoy. Either may be at either end.

#### 8 THE FINISH

8.1 The finishing line will be between the staff on the Race Committee boat and a buoy.

#### 9 PENALTY SYSTEM

- 9.1 US Sailing Prescription Appendix V is in effect.
- 9.2 Team racing during singles competition is cause for disqualification by the Race Committee (team racing is 2 boats racing as a team).

#### 10 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 10.1 Protest forms are available at the Race Committee boat. Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered there within the appropriate time limit.
- 10.2 Protest time limit is 45 minutes after the Race Committee arrives at the dock after the last race of the day.
- 10.3 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held at an announced time and location.

#### 11 SCORING

11.1 The scoring system is as follows:

Did not compete (DNC): points = number of boats registered for race plus 10.
