World War II

Army Pfc. William Simon – 20. Lost November 5, 1944 when his unit was engaged in battle with German forces in the Raffelsbrand sector of the Hütgen Forest in Germany. Accounted for November 29, 2022..

Navy Seaman 2nd Class David Riley – 25. Lost December 7, 1941, during the attack on Pearl Harbor, December 7, 1941 – USS Oklahoma. Accounted for February 24, 2021. Announced December 20, 2022

Korea

Army Pfc. Dale Thompson – 19. December 2, 1950, when he went missing during a battle with enemy forces near the Chosin Reservoir, North Korea. His remains could not be recovered. Accounted for November 28, 2022.

Army Pfc. James Miller – 21. Lost July 30, 1950 When his unit was engaged in battle in an effort to defend the town of Sangju, Following the battle his remains could not be recovered and there is no evidence he was ever a prisoner of war. Accounted for November 28, 2022.

WWII BOAT DISCOVERED AT SHASTA LAKE

A World War II-era boat was discovered at drought-stricken Shasta Lake. The Shasta-Trinity National Forest shared photos of the vessel it's called the Higgins boat, or "Ghost Boat."

Officials discovered that the boat has "31-17" marked on its side which is confirmation that the ship was assigned to the attack transport USS Monrovia. The boat was also used as a headquarters for Gen. George S. Patton during the 1943 invasion of Sicily. Dwight Eisenhower was also on this ship at the time, and it went on to a further 6 D-Day invasion in the Pacific.

Any restoration will be done to preserve as much of the integrity of the boat as possible and will hopefully preserve it in a weathered 'combat fatigue' look, and that is how it is intended to be displayed at a museum in Nebraska."

How the Higgins boat sank remains unknown, but drought conditions in the western U.S. have led to other discoveries. In July, another Higgins boat surfaced on Nevada's Lake Mead because of the receding waters amid rising temperatures.

The real question is how did these boats end up in a Lake?
