World War II

Seaman 1st Class Buford Dyer – 19. Lost December 7, 1941, during the attack on Pearl Harbor, December 7, 1941 – USS Oklahoma. Accounted for August 5, 2021. Announced December 1, 2021.

Electrician's Mate 1st Class Edward Conway – 29. Lost December 7, 1941, during the attack on Pearl Harbor, December 7, 1941 – USS Oklahoma. Accounted for October 1, 2021. Announced December 15, 2021.

Seaman 2nd Class Tceollyar Simmons – 18. Lost December 7, 1941, during the attack on Pearl Harbor, December 7, 1941 – USS California. Accounted for November 18, 2021. Announced December 15, 2021.

Fire Controlman 1st Class Hubert Clement – 30. Lost December 7, 1941, during the attack on Pearl Harbor, December 7, 1941 – USS Oklahoma. Accounted for October 1, 2021. Announced December 15, 2021.

Seaman 1st Class Wilbur Newton – 29. Lost December 7, 1941, during the attack on Pearl Harbor, December 7, 1941 – USS Oklahoma. Accounted for October 1, 2021. Announced December 15, 2021.

Army Air Forces Capt. Nando Cavalieri – 24. Lost February 3, 1945, when the B-17G he was serving as a bombardier on was struck by enemy anti-aircraft fire. The plane broke into pieces German forces recovered his remains and buried him Döberitz, Germany. Accounted for July 27, 2021. Announced December 20, 2021.

Korea

Army Sgt. James Stryker – 20. Lost May 18, 1951, when his unit was attacked near Han'gye, South Korea. His remains could not be recovered. Accounted for August 5, 2021. Announced December 2, 2021.

Army M.Sgt. James Quong – 30. Lost December 2, 1950, when his unit was attacked by enemy forces near Chosin Reservoir, North Korea. Accounted for June 18, 2020, Announced December 2, 2021.

Army Cpl. Benjamin Bazzell – 18. Lost November 30, 1950, when his unit was attacked by enemy forces near Chosin Reservoir, North Korea. Accounted for June 18, 2020, Announced December 2, 2021.

The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency announced that 33 Sailors from the USS Oklahoma killed during World War II were accounted for on October 18, 2021.

To date 396 USS Oklahoma Sailors and Marines have been identified. The remains unable to be matched with individual Sailors have been designated as group remains. The Sailors who have not previously been identified are accounted for in this group and are listed below.
