**Historian's Fun Facts:** Fun Fact #2, on July 1, 1946, Bulova watches became the very first TV commercial .

### Bulova: First in Time, First on TV!

Did you know the first-ever television commercial in U.S. history was for a watch? That's right — on July 1, 1941, Bulova made history with a 10-second spot that aired before a baseball game.

The ad simply showed a clock and the words:

"America runs on Bulova time."

It cost just \$9!

But Bulova didn't just lead the way in advertising — they've had a proud connection to the U.S. military for over a century. During World War I and II, Bulova supplied watches, timekeeping devices, and precision instruments to the armed forces. Their military watches became known for their rugged reliability and accuracy in the field.

So whether you're checking the time or honoring American innovation, remember — Bulova was first, and still keeps time with history.

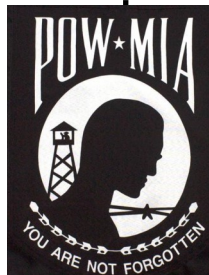

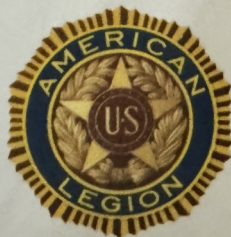

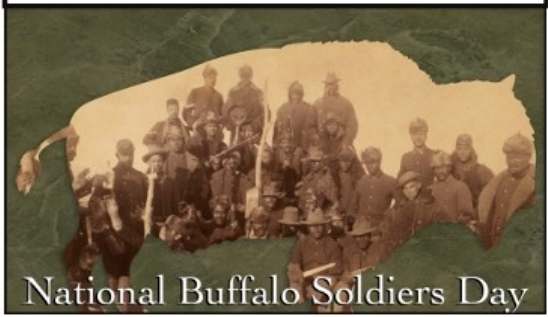
