Army Air Force Sgt. Francis Wiemerslage – 20. Lost March 2, 1945, when the B-17G Bomber he was a ball turret gunner came under attack by enemy fighters between Berlin and Leipzig on a bombing run over Dresden. Accounted for August 24, 2021. Announced August 31, 2021.

Navy Seaman 2nd Class John G. Brock – 18 Lost December 7, 1941, during the attack on Pearl Harbor, December 7, 1941 – USS Oklahoma. Accounted for May 19, 2021. Announced September 1, 2021.

Navy Hospital Apprentice 1st Class Keefe Connolly – 19. Lost December 7, 1941, during the attack on Pearl Harbor, December 7, 1941 – USS Oklahoma. Accounted for February 11, 2021. Announced September 2, 2021.

Marine Corps. Cpl. Andrew Pellerito – 22. Lost November 1943 when his Battalion was attacked by Japanese resistance while attempting to secure the small island of Betio in the Gilbert Islands. Accounted for August 19, 2021. Announced September 2, 2021.

Navy Seaman 1st Class Buford Dyer – 19. Lost December 7, 1941, during the attack on Pearl Harbor, December 7, 1941 – USS Oklahoma. Accounted for August 5, 2021. Announced September 20, 2021.

Navy Fireman 2nd Class Benjimin Terhune - 19. Lost December 7, 1941, during the attack on Pearl Harbor, December 7, 1941 – USS Oklahoma. Accounted for August 5, 2021. Announced September 20, 2021.

WORLD WAR II SUBMARINE FOUND OFF THE COAST OF JAPAN, ENDING 75-YEAR MYSTERY.

Stories of sunken ships have fascinated the world for centuries, including the story of the USS Grayback. It was one of 52 U.S. submarines reported missing during the great conflict. Six have been found in the decades since, and now the Grayback can be added to the list of subs whose demise is no longer a mystery. The Lost 52 Project is an organization dedicating its time and resources to finding these lost subs. This month, the Navy History and Heritage Command verified the discovery of the Grayback, which the Lost 52 Project found 1,427 feet below sea level on June 5 off Okinawa's coast. It's the first U.S. submarine to be found in waters off Japan.

The Lost 52 team discovered that historical documents erred in the translation of the longitude of where the Grayback sank. With the new data and newly discovered Japanese mission logs, the searchers were able to refocus their efforts and found the dilapidated sub 100 miles from the area recorded in the original historical records.

The Grayback was one of the most successful submarines of World War II, but it never returned from its last mission in late February 1944.

The USS Grayback was commissioned on June 30, 1941 and set sail for Pearl Harbor about six months later, quickly becoming a major part of the war's submarine offensive. In two years, it went on 10 successful patrols, during which it sank a total of 63,835 tons and 14 ships. The Grayback left Pearl Harbor for the last time on Jan. 28, 1944, on its way to the East China Sea for its 10th patrol. About a month later, the sub radioed that it had sunk two Japanese army cargo ships. The Grayback had only two torpedoes remaining, so it was ordered back home. Soon after, though, it was reported that the sub was damaged by enemy aircraft, but it still managed to sink an enemy naval transport on Feb. 27. The Grayback was expected at Midway on March 7, 1944, but it never arrived and was never heard from again.

This is how the Naval History and Heritage Command documented its demise: "That same day [Feb. 27], a Japanese carrier-based plane spotted a submarine on the surface in the East China Sea and attacked. According to Japanese reports, the submarine exploded and sank immediately, but antisubmarine craft were called in to depth-charge the area, clearly marked by a trail of air bubbles, until at last a heavy oil slick swelled to the surface.

The rest, as they say, is history, except that now a new chapter can be opened – one that can bring closure to the families of the long-lost sailors who gave their lives for the greater good


