#### World War II

Navy Seaman 1<sup>st</sup> Class Houston Temples – 24. Lost December 7, 1941, during the attack on Pearl Harbor – USS Oklahoma. Accounted for April 16, 2021. Announced June 9, 2022.

Army Staff Sgt. Casimir Lobacz – 25. Lost September 7, 1944 when his Company was advancing through France as part of the Lorraine Campaign and came under ground attack. Accounted for March 2, 2022. Announced June 16, 2022.

Army Tech. Sgt. Ross Thompson – 50. Lost December 10, 1942 after the Bataan Death March and held as a Prisoner of War in Cabanatuan POW camp where he parished. Accounted for November 10, 2021. Announced June 16, 2022.

Army Pfc. David Owens – 27. Lost November 22, 1944 when his unit was engaged in battle with German forces near Hürtgen Forest when he was reported killed in action. Because of the fighting, his body was unable to be recovered. Accounted for June 15, 2022.

Army Pvt. Carl Dorsey – 19. Lost November 22, 1944 when his unit was engaged in battle with German forces near Grosshau, Germany, in the Hürtgen Forest when he was reported killed in action. Because of the fighting, his body was unable to be recovered. Accounted for June 15, 2022.

**Army Sgt. Garland Collier – 25.** Lost during Operation Market Garden on October 5, 1944 when he sustained fatal wounds from mortar fire. Announced June 17, 2022.

Army Pvt. John Cooper – 37. Lost March 7, 1945 when his tank was struck by enemy shoulder-fired rocket near Lampaden Germany. Cooper escaped the tank but was never seen again. Accounted for June 21, 2022.

#### Korea

Army Sgt. 1<sup>st</sup> Class James Coleman – 22. Lost April 25, 1951 when his Division was enaged with Chinese Communist Forces near the Hwach-on Resevoir. Accounted for May 23, 2022.





#### US WILL BRING HOME AND IDENTIFY REMAINS OF UNKNOWN SOLDIERS FROM THE ONLY AMERICAN CEMETERY IN AFRICA.

On Memorial Day 2022 the US Embassy in Tunisia announced that the U.S. is set to bring home and identify the remains of unknown World War II soldiers from the only American cemetery in Africa.

The announcement comes after the US and Tunisia signed a memorandum of understanding that will allow the US to exhume the remains of unknown soldiers from the North African American Cemetery and repatriate them for identification and reunification with family members.

"Today's historic agreement will ensure American service men and women who gave their lives to defend our freedom are recognized and honored for the ultimate sacrifice they gave to our country," said the embassy's spokesperson.

The cemetery in Carthage, Tunisia, near the Mediterranean Sea is the burial site for 2,841 US service members from the North African campaign. The Wall of the Missing, a memorial wall bordering the cemetery, lists the names of 3,724 service members who went missing in action and have never been found.

#### REMAINS PILOT MIA IN WW2 RECOVERED

After all these decades, a mystery has been solved. And it's all because of a dedicated researcher and a chance find in an archive in Thailand.

We owe our fallen heroes and their families a profound debt of gratitude," said the embassy's spokesperson.

HERE ARE RECORDED THE NAMES OF AMERICANS WHO GAVE THEIR LIVES IN THE SERVICE OF THEIR COUNTRY AND WHO SLEEP IN UNKNOWN GRAVES 1941 - 1945 INTO THY HANDS O LORD

There are 47,000 U.S. military personnel still missing from World War II who are considered Missing In Action in Asian war zones. Now, researchers believe they've found the remains of an Army pilot who disappeared over Thailand in 1944. The remains will be analyzed to confirm identification. Earlier in May, a ceremony was held at the U.S. airbase in Thailand to pay respects and send the remains home.

The investigation that led to the discovery was led by a retired Thailand Air Force Officer; he had heard rumors of a World War II plane crash but couldn't find records of it. In 2011, flooding threatened the museum archives, so he went through the records to check their condition and came across a police report from 1944 that cited the precise date and location where a Reconnaissance P-38 went down after being struck by lightning.

It took 10 years to start sifting through the field, and in April they found remains. The U.S. military has a special facility in Hawaii where they will analyze the remains to confirm their identity.

#### KNOW WHEN TO FLY THE U.S. FLAG AT HALF-STAFF.

As we celebrate Independence Day a question the Americanism Division at National Headquarter often receives is when the flag should be flown at half-staff. Days in the year that the flag is to be flown at half-staff include Memorial Day (May), Peace Officers Memorial Day (May) Patriot Day (Sept. 11), National Fallen Firefighters Memorial Service (October) and Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day (Dec. 7).

The flag is to be flow at full staff on Armed Forces Day, Flag Day, Independence Day, and Labor Day. Unless the State Governor or the president of the United States has a half-staff proclamation issued, the United States flag is to be displayed at full staff.



#### To the right or left?


The flag, when carried in a procession with another flag or flags, should be either on the marching right; that is, the flag's own right, or, if there is a line of other flags, in front of the center of that line.
