World War II

Army Staff Sgt. – Casimir P. Lobacz - 25. Lost Septmeber 27, 1944 Lost when his unit was part of a ground attock on Fort Driant near Metz, France. Accounted for March 2, 2022.

Army Air Forces 1st Lt. Newell F. Mills, Jr. - 21. Lost when his P-15D came under attack while escorting a formation of B-24 Bombers to a target in Geesthacht, Germany. Following the mission Lt. Mills and his wingman never returned to base and were never reported as prisoners of war. Accounted for March 7, 2022.

Navy Water Tender1st Class Oliver K. Burger – 26. Lost December 7, 1941, during the attack on Pearl Harbor – USS Oklahoma. Accounted for November 24, 2020. Announced March 9, 2022.

Army Air Froce Pfc. Edward H. Benson – 22. Lost March 22, 1945 when Sorido Airstip was attacked by a Japanese air raid and 40 service members were killed. Of those 40 three, including Benson could not be identified after the attack. Accounted for January 31, 2022. Announced March 10, 2022.

Army Pvt. Edward Ryan – 33. Lost Ju,y 7, 1944, Lost when Japances forces ordered a mass suicide charge on his division. Ryan was killed sometime during the attack. He was posthumously awarded the Bronze Star. Accounted for November 3, 2021. Announced March 10, 2022.

Army Air Forces Staff Sgt. Richard Salisbury – 19. Lost August 1, 1944 when the B-24 Liberator on which he was serving as a gunner crashed as a result of enemy anti-aircraft fire during Operation Tidal Wave. Accounted for Septmber 23, 2021, Announced March 11, 2022.

Navy Coxswain Paul Boemer – 21. Lost December 7, 1941, during the attack on Pearl Harbor – USS Oklahoma. Accounted for September 29, 2020. Announced February 22, 2022.

Navy Water Tender 1st Class Milo Phillips - 26. Lost December 7, 1941, during the attack on Pearl Harbor – USS Oklahoma. Accounted for January 4, 2021. Announced February 25, 2022. Navy Fireman 2nd Class Hal Allsion – 21. Lost December 7, 1941, during the attack on Pearl Harbor – USS Oklahoma. Accounted for October 14, 2021. Announced March 22, 2022.

Army Air Forces 2nd Lt. Eugene Shauvin – 25. Lost Septmeber 17, 1944 while piloting a C-47 Skytrain that was shot down over Belgion, in route to the Netherlands to drop 11 paratroopers ahead of Operation Market Garden. Only six paratroopers bailed out. The four person crew, including Shauvin, and the other five paratroopers died in the crash. Accounted for March 2, 2022.

Army Pvt. Peral Barrow – 36. Lost November 20, 1944 when his unit was engaged in battle with German forces near Hurtgen, Germany when he was reproted as killed in action. Because of the fightinbg his body was unable to be recovered. Accounted January 9, 2020. Announced March 24, 2022.




NET CALL - NET CALL
