MIA Update | Coming Home.

8 Army Cpl. Melvin R. Hill, 19, of Pomona, California. In November 1950, Cpl. Hill's unit was assembled with South Korean soldiers in the 31st Regimental Combat Team on the east side of the Chosin River, North Korea. After several days of intense fighting, approximately 1,300 members of the RCT were killed or captured in enemy territory. Hill was declared MIA on Dec. 6, 1950. He was buried on Feb. 4, 2017 in Alex, Oklahoma.

8 Army Master Sgt. Ira V. Miss, Jr. 23, of Frederick, Maryland. He was a member of Headquarters Company, 3rd Battalion, 38th Infantry Regiment, 2nd Infantry Division. He was operating in the Central Corridor in South Korea. Miss was reported missing in action on Feb. 13, 1951, after Chinese forces overran the roadblock he was manning. He was buried on Feb. 8th in Arlington National Cemetery.



Vietnam Veteran Memorial Pins were presented to eight qualifying service members at the February 15th General Membership meeting. If you served on active duty during the *Vietnam Era* (November 1, 1955 to May 15, 1975)

regardless of location you are eligible, you do not need to be a member of the American Legion to receive a Vietnam Veteran Lapel Pin.

The Vietnam Veterans Memorial pays tribute to the brave members of the U.S. Armed Forces who fought in the Vietnam War and were killed or missing in action.

The memorial consists of three separate parts: The Three Soldiers statue, the Vietnam Women's Memorial and the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall, which is the most popular feature.

There are 58,282 names now listed on that polished black wall, approximately 1,200 of these are listed as missing.





The names

arranged in the order in which they were taken from us by date and within each date the names are alphabetized. It is hard to believe it is 36 years since the

last casualties. There were 997 soldiers that were killed on their first day in Vietnam and 1,448 soldiers were killed on their last day in Vietnam.

Since Vietnam, Americans who served their country in Southeast Asia in this nation's longest war continue to suffer premature deaths related to their service. There is no comprehensive record of these "hidden casualties" of Vietnam. Their names will never be inscribed on the Wall.

There is a void at the Wall. To help bridge the void there was a plaque on the Memorial grounds, bearing no names, but designed and worded to acknowledge and commemorate these evergrowing postwar casualties.

IN MEMORY
OF THE MEN AND WOMEN
WHO SERVED IN THE VIETNAM WAR
AND LATER DIED AS A RESULT
OF THEIR SERVICE
WE HONOR AND REMEMBER
THEIR SACRIFICE

Most Americans will only see the numbers that the Vietnam War created. To those of us who survived the war, and to the families of those who did not, we see the faces, we feel the pain that these numbers created. We are, until we too pass away, haunted with these numbers, because they were our friends, fathers, husbands, wives, sons and daughters.

There are no noble wars, just noble warriors.
