The most recent identified POW/MIA.

World War II

Marine Corps Sgt. Arthur Ervin - 22. Lost July 5, 1944 when he was shot by a sniper while trying to assist a wounded comrade during the invasion of the island of Saipan. Due to the chaos surrounding the battle and its aftermath, his body was unable to be recovered. Announced June 21, 2022.

Army Pfc. John Ferguson – 20. Lost December 10, 1942 after suviving the Baraan Death March and being held as a priosner of war at the Cabanatua POW camp, where he perished. Accounted for July 14, 2022.

Army Pfc. John Gordon – 32. Lost January 17, 1945 when his unit was engaged with German forces during the Battle of Reipertswiller in France. Gordon was killed when his company was subjected to a German counter attack. Accounted for July 13, 2022.

U.S. Army Air Forces Sgt. Zelwood Gravlin – 21. Lost August 1, 1943 when the B-24 Liberator he was serving on as the armorer-gunner was hit by anti-aircraft fire and crashed during Operation Tidal Wave. Accounted for July 12, 2022.

Army Pfc. Donald Hofman – 19 Lost January 20, 1945 when his unit was surrounded by German forces while being pounded by artillery and mortar fire. Only two men made it through German lines. The rest were either captured or killed. Hofman was among those killed. Accounted for July 8, 2022.

Navy Machinist's Mate 1st Class Keith Tipsword – 27. Lost December 7, 1941, during the attack on Pearl Harbor – USS Virgina. Accounted for July 12, 2022.

Army Pfc. Lowell Smith – 24. Lost January 21, 1945 when his rifle squad attacked German forces surrounding several companies in an attempt to help them break out. His squad came under enemy artillery and mortar fire followed by sniper and machind gun fire and was forced to withdraw. When the unit reassembled, Smith was missing. German records disovered a death report for Smith dated the day he went missing. Accounted for June 21, 2022.

U.S. Army Air Forces Sgt. Herald Boyd—25. Lost February 3, 1945 when the B-17G Flying Fortress bomber he was serving as a gunner was struck by a ground rocket immediately after dropping its bombs, the plane crashed in a residential area of Berlin. Boyd was killed in the crash. Accounted for July 8, 2022.

Marine Corps Cpl. Jack Brown – 22. Lost July 8, 1944 during the invasion of the island of Saipan. Brown was reported killed in action but his body was not able to be recovered. He was posthumously awarded the Bronze Star and Purple Heart. Annouced July 14, 2022

U.S. Army Air Forces Staff Sgt. Moses Tate – 23. Lost August 1, 1943 when the B-24 Leberator on which Tate was a gunner was hit by anti-aircraft fire and crashed during Operation TIDAL WAVE. Accounted for July 12, 2022.

U.S. Army Air Froces 2nd Lt. Pharis Weekley – 21. Lost August 1, 1943 when the B-24 Liberator on which he was serving as navigator was hit by anti-aircraft fire and crashed during Operation TIDAL WAVE. Accounted for July 12, 2022.

Korea

Army Pfc. Eward Reiter – 27. Lost July 7, 1950 when his unit sustained heavy casualties while defending against the Norh Korean army's advance near Ch'onan, South Korea. His body was not recovered beacause his unit was forced to retreat. Accounted for June 21, 2022.

Army Pfc. Donald Born – 19. Lost July 30, 1950 when his unit came under attack by the North Korean People's Army causing his unit to withdraw to a new position. Born went missing during the attack and was never listed as a priosoner of war. Accounted for June 21, 2022.

Army Pfc. Melvin Little Bear – 21. Lost July 21, 1951 when his unit was attacked by the Chinese People's Volunteer Forces. He was captured and was a prisoner of war at POW Camp No. 1 in North Korea, Little Bear died in captivity. Accounted for July 13, 2022.

Army Priveate Felix Yanez – 19. Lost July 16, 1950 when his Unit came under attack by the North Korean People's Army along the Kum River, north of Taejon, South Korea. Accounted for July 13, 2022.
















The three-rifle volley consists of no less than three and no more than seven rifles firing three volleys in memory of the fallen. The original history comes from the Roman era that at the end of the day of battle when the field of battle was cleared, if the soldier removing the slain soldier knew the name of the soldier, then they would call his name three times into the night as a form of remembering their sacrifice.

Typically, three fired cartridges are placed into the folded flag prior to presentation to the next of kin; the cartridges signify "duty, honor, and sacrifice."
