Following is a summary of News Stories of the most recent identified POW/MIA members from World War II and the Korean War.



Army Air Forces 2nd Lt. Lynn W. Hadfield. On March 21, 1945 his aircraft was hit by anti-aircraft fire and went missing during a combat mission from France to Germany. Hadfield was accounted for on December 13, 2018 and will be buried March 21, 2019, in Sandy, Utah.

U.S. Army Air Forces 1st Lt. Howard T. Lurcott, On January 21, 1944, the B-24J bomber aircraft he was piloting crashed into Tarawa lagoon shortly after takeoff. Lurcott and the nine other servicemen aboard the aircraft were killed, he was accounted for on January 28, 2019.

Marine Corps Reserve Pvt. Ted Hall. On December 7, 1941 Pvt. Hall was killed during the attack on the USS Oklahoma he, was accounted for on Jan. 16, 2019.

Baker 2nd Class David L. Kesler. On December 7, 1941 Baker 2nd Class David Kesler was killed during the attack on the USS Oklahoma, he was accounted for on Jan. 17, 2019.

Navy Seaman 1st Class Frank A. Hryniewicz. On December 7, 1942 Navy Seaman 1st Class Frank Hrynieicz was killed during the attack on the USS Oklahoma, he was accounted for on Jan. 28, 2019.



Army Pfc. James C. Williams, on July 20, 1950, Williams was killed while trying to transport patients from the Taejon Air Strip. Despite multiple attempts to recover Williams' remains, he was declared non-recoverable on Jan. 16, 1956. He was accounted for on December 20, 2019.

Army Sgt. Frank J. Suliman, On Dec. 1, 1950, Suliman was captured and taken to the CPVF prisoner of war camp at Pukchin-Tarigol, North Korea, where he reportedly died in March 1951.

On July 27, 2018, the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK) turned over 55 boxes, purported to contain the remains of U.S. servicemen killed during the Korean War. Sgt. Suliman was accounted for on Jan 15, 2019.

Army Pvt. Winfred L. Reynolds, He was killed on April 26, 1951, while caring for wounded Soldiers. Because of ongoing fighting in the area, Reynolds' remains could not be recovered. Accounted for January 16,2019.
