Service Officer: 100 Days in The Ghan is a captivating story of one ordinary kid who felt called to serve following 9/11 and was ultimately severely wounded in action. Wiggins story begins on 9/11 and walks readers through a series of events that lead him and his friends to join the military. Upon completing training Wiggins finds himself in the Nation's oldest and most prestigious Special Operations Unit, the Airborne Rangers. During his time in the Rangers, Wiggins deploys in support of the Global War on Terrorism five different times. An ambush on May 13, 2004, left Wiggins now 25 deaf and with other serious injuries. Wiggins dies on a battlefield in Afghanistan (The Gan) several times only to prove all of the doctors wrong and makes a near full recovery. More than three years later, Wiggins was living in Oregon, serving as president of Evergreen Defense and Security Services and working on obtaining his bachelor's degree at Linfield College.
