House Passes New "Forever" G.I. Bill

Without a single vote in opposition, the U.S. House of Representatives passed a bill Monday night to expand the <u>post-9/11 GI Bill</u> and eliminate the 15-year time limit on the use of education benefits for new recruits.

The vote was 405-0 in a rare display of bipartisanship in Congress on behalf of veterans seeking higher education after active duty service

Rep. Phil Roe, R-Tenn., chairman of the House Veterans Affairs Committee, said he expects the Senate to take up and pass the bill later this week and move it to the White House for possible signing by President Donald Trump before Congress goes into its August recess.

Trump could also wait for Congress to return after Labor Day before signing it.

The bill, named the Harry W. Colmery Veterans Educational Assistance Act of 2017 -- for the American Legion member who wrote the initial World War II GI Bill, would eliminate the current 15-year time limit on use of the GI Bill for those who enlist after January 2018.

PURPLE HEART DAY

On August 7th commemorates the day in 1782 when General George Washington created the Purple Heart Medal – a military decoration that is

awarded to those wounded or killed while serving in the United States Armed Forces.

The Purple Heart is a heart shaped purple medal with a gold border. The front has a profile of George Washington while the back has the words for military merit inscribed on it. The medal is attached to a piece of purple silk with a silver border.

The holiday also encourages people to pay their respects to fallen soldiers to listen to the stories from our veterans and to thank them for their service to our nation.
