Please, please, please, make sure that when you are using the using the cabbing machines to take care of them by sweeping the stone across the entire width of the wheel and not just one area. We have multiple wheels that have been worn only in the middle and the edges are basically brand new. This uneven wear is unnecessary if everyone takes his or her time and uses good techniques.

Also, when you're done with your stone, make sure you take the wax off the dopstick. Please don't just leave the waxed dops in the bin. Get them prepped for the next person to use. We also seem to have the dops walk away. Please do not take the club's dops home with you. You're welcome to bring your own.

METAL SHOP

The Fundamentals of Silversmithing

The Tampa Bay Mineral & Science Club (TBMSC) offers a series of three classes in The Fundamentals of Silversmithing Course. Each class in the course is designed to teach a certain set of skills that build upon those skills tAug.ht in the previous class, so that by the end of the three-class course a student with absolutely no experience in silversmithing will have the skills needed to be able to set up their own home shop and begin creating jewelry on their own and/or come into the club and use the club's Metal Shop facilities during Open Shop (times where there are no structured classes). No prior experience needed.

Please note: All materials and the use of tools needed to complete each project are included in the cost of the course EXCEPT the following:

- Cabochons (finished stones) for the second and third classes.
- Optivisor

Students are responsible for providing their owns stones, and all students must bring an Optivisor. Optivisors may be purchased through Amazon.



If you'd like to learn how to cut rocks into beautiful gemstones, the next available classes have been posted for July:


- July 6-7






Students will also be tAug.ht the proper operation and care of a faceting machine. Each student will complete one stone.

Cost is \$210 total, which includes materials, instructor fee, club shop time and use of machines. A deposit of \$110 is required to reserve a seat. The balance of \$100 should be paid directly to the instructor on the first day of class.

Each student should have his/her own Optivisor to closely examine the stone during the cutting process. These are available on Amazon or Harbor Freight.






Used 4-inch trim saw \$150 obo

Brad's Bench Tips

Versatile sanding disks

One of the flexshaft tools that saves so much time is the snap-on sanding disk. I mainly use the medium and fine grits but sometimes like the very fine ones that are sold for working with platinum.

Ordinarily, you'd think of placing the disk on the mandrel with the grit side facing away from your hand, but notice that you end up with your elbow up in the air. Instead, try flipping the disk so that the grit side is towards your hand. It's a much more comfortable position because the elbow is down near your side, and it lets me hold the work up close where I have a better view of what I'm sanding.

I use these snap-on disks so frequently that I keep multiple mandrels with different grits already mounted in the bur stand. Some mandrels have the grit facing out and some facing in.



Easier prong setting

When setting stones in a prong mount, the tool is less likely to slip off the prong if you grind a shallow groove into its face or rough up the face a bit with sandpaper. Some folks prefer a prong pusher for doing this, and others like a set of pliers with a slight groove on one jaw.

The easiest way to create a slot on the pusher is with a file, and the quickest way to create a slot on one jaw of your pliers is with a Sept.arating disc. Then do a rough polish on the slot with a medium grit, knife-edge silicone wheel.

It details 24 different techniques for adding texture to your jewelry and metal work without the need for heavy equipment like a mill. The techniques make use of more common tools and materials around the shop — like hammers, stamps, punches, and tool bits for the Dremel or Foredom.

Each technique is explained in detail with:

- Description and pictures of the technique
- Procedures for creating the texture
- List of tools and supplies needed
- Options for modifying and personalizing

These methods are both useful and practical. I use them in my own work, and I teach them to others in classes and workshops. What's more is they're practical. None should put a dent in your budget.


