



Rockhounding presentation




PRESENTATION: Club member Michelle Wacker shared her experiences mining in the Southeast, Arkansas and New York.

MEET THE INSTRUCTOR: LISA MILLER





Lisa Miller, our Silver instructor, was born and raised in Wyoming. She joined the Tampa Bay Mineral and Science Club in 2016 and previously taught here from 2017 through 2022.

She started Silversmithing in 2016, and took the Basic Silversmithing class from Vicki Prilliman at William Holland in 2016, and since has taken different online courses.

Lisa owned the business Dragonfly Beading from 2006-2010 where she made beaded jewelry.

Her other hobbies include crochet, flower gardening, furniture refinishing, beading and card making.



The Fundamentals of Silversmithing

The Tampa Bay Mineral & Science Club (TBMSC) offers a series of three classes in The Fundamentals of Silversmithing Course. Each class in the course is designed to teach a certain set of skills that build upon those skills taught in the previous class, so that by the end of the three-class course a student with absolutely no experience in silversmithing will have the skills needed to be able to set up their own home shop and begin creating jewelry on their own and/or come into the club and use the club's Metal Shop facilities during Open Shop (times where there are no structured classes). No prior experience needed.

Please Note: All materials and the use of tools needed to complete each project are included in the cost of the course EXCEPT the following:


- Cabochons (finished stones) for the second and third classes.
- Optivisor

Students are responsible for providing their owns stones, and all students must bring an Optivisor.

Optivisors may be purchased through Amazon.

NEXT CLASS: 9 a.m.-1 p.m. Saturday, June 22. Class registration needs to close the Thursday before each class so Lisa can get a head count and make preparations. The total cost for this class is \$65. The cost includes materials, instructor fee and shop fees. (The materials fee is subject to change based upon the market price of silver). The total cost of theclass must be paid prior to the start of the course and is payable as follows:

TABLE CRAFTS

Table Crafts sessions move to new day



Yes, Table Crafts has moved to from 10 a.m.-1 p.m. Wednesdays in June. These open sessions are \$3.50 per hour or \$10 for three hours.

I hope to see more people with my plans for July. I have samples of four small ornaments or fan pulls, all done in Peyote stitch. The Santas are single peyote, the Santa with Presents and the Winter Trees are two-drop peyote, and the Presents with Bows is three-drop peyote.

If you don't know how to do peyote stitch, come and learn this stitch and how to read a chart and a word pattern on July 3. This session is \$10 for three hours, and materials are provided.

The Santas will be taught on July 10, the Santa with Presents will be on July 17, the Winter Trees will be on July 24, and Presents and Bows will be on July 31. All the ornaments will take approximately four hours, so plan on 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. with a break for lunch (BYO Lunch/Drink). The cost will be \$27.50 for each ornament. (\$13.50 goes to the club and \$14 goes to me for materials. If you are already a beader, talk to me about providing your own materials.)

Materials include wooden spool, beads, thread, needle, finishing kit (large trim beads, metallic cord, charm, and jump ring), plus the pattern which is copyrighted.

These ornaments will be on display at the clubhouse if you'd like to see them in person. Contact Christy Gorrow at cgorrow@juno.com to sign up or if you have more questions.

There still are some nice slabs for sale



Please, please, please, make sure that when you are using the using the cabbing machines to take care of them by sweeping the stone across the entire width of the wheel and not just one area. We have multiple wheels that have been worn only in the middle and the edges are basically brand new. This uneven wear is unnecessary if everyone takes his or her time and uses good techniques.

Beginning Cabochon class



Here are dates for upcoming lapidary classes:

- July 13-14, 9 a.m.-5 p.m.

This is a two-day workshop covering the basics of turning slabs of rocks into polished pieces.

The cost of the class is \$230, which includes materials, instructor fees and shop time. A deposit of \$125 is required to save a spot, and the balance of \$100 should be paid to the instructor the day of the class.

You must wear closed-toed shoes. Bring a waterproof apron, an Optivisor, a large towel and lunch.

Beginning Faceting class



Here are dates for upcoming faceting classes:

- June 29-30, 9 a.m.-3 p.m.
- July 6-7, 9 a.m.-3 p.m.
- July 27-28, 9 a.m.-3 p.m.

This is a two-day introductory class on cutting faceted gemstones (transparent stones similar in appearance to diamonds). The following topics will be covered in the class: Choosing cutting material, stone dopping, facet cutting and polishing, transferring a stone.

Students will also be taught the proper operation and care of a faceting machine. Each student will complete one stone.

Cost is \$210 total, which includes materials, instructor fee, club shop time and use of machines. A deposit of \$110 is required to reserve a seat. The balance of \$100 should be paid directly to the instructor on the first day of class.

Each student should have his/her own Optivisor to closely examine the stone during the cutting process. These are available on Amazon or Harbor Freight.




Used 4-inch trim saw \$150

JUNE 1, 2024

Meeting called to order at 11:39 a.m. by club vice president Lyra Solochek

Treasurer's report: Linda Collins, treasurer, was unable to attend. The full report will be posted in the next edition of The Geode newsletter.

Construction update: Lyra Solochek

It has been one year since the project began. Several items are near completion, while others are in the works. The next phase includes painting the building exterior. The membership will be asked to vote on five colors at the end of this meeting. The estimated cost of the painting is \$3,500.

Department updates: Lyra Solochek

Lapidary — Received a new estate donation in late May. The next classes will be July 13-14.

Faceting — Instructor Tom Dershem is still out recuperating. Instructor Jim Kammel is the current contact. The next classes will be in late June 29-30.

Metal — The Metal Shop is being restructured. Lisa Miller will be the new lead instructor. The class model is being revised into several smaller courses instead of one nine-week program.

Open shop — Because of rising costs, the price will increase to \$6 per hour from \$5. Members will be able to buy prepaid punch cards of \$100 for five 4-hour sessions. The cards will have no expiration date, and will not be replaced if lost.

Board elections: Lyra Solochek

Three board seats will be up for election in October. Interested members should contact Lyra or Peter Favaro, president.

Announcements:

Lyra says the club is short on tools such as ratchet wrenches and electric drills. Any members who have items to donate may do so, before the club invests in new tools.

Instructor Jim Kammel is hosting an arts and crafts show in Dunedin on June 20 from 5-8 p.m. Anyone interested in having a table at the show should contact Jim.

Show update: Greig Lundergan

The next show is scheduled for the first weekend of November. Invitations for vendors are set to go out the first week of June, giving more time to determine how many new vendors are able to participate. At least 8-10 new vendors have expressed interest. Volunteers for the show will be needed. The club is seeking donations of rocks to include in sluice bags.

Paint colors: The membership reviewed five paint samples for the exterior of the club building. The two top choices were advanced to the club board for a decision.


