


Please share your opinion on our Open Shops and how we could improve them.

- I am unable to answer as I have not attended one yet. I travel to the club


Please select your areas of interest. 36 responses




What class format do you prefer? A several-week series of classes or shorter workshops? 35 responses



What time/day of the week would be best for you for classes and Open Shop? 34 responses





Some outdoor fun with Raku and metal clay

Barbara Rivolta took her class outside on May 21 for the Raku Fired Porcelain and Metal Clay Necklace class. First used in 16th century Japan to make simple wares for the tea ceremony, today's Western style Raku emphasizes intense metallic colors and lusters perfect for jewelry. These colors are produced by taking the hot wares from the kiln, plunging them into a container of combustibles, and allowing them to smoke. Select various shapes of porcelain bisque beads for your necklace design or bring your own handmade ceramic beads and cabochons. Glaze the beads using low fire Raku glazes and embellish them with silver metal clay for even more lustrous effects. The beads were fired using a smokeless firing technique adapted for firing small jewelry pieces.



Brad's Bench Tips

One-part die forming

An easy way to make large and strong components for your jewelry designs while keeping the weight of precious metal to a minimum is done with simple tools in a process called one-part die forming. Complex 3-D shapes can be made quickly from thin gauge sheet with just a piece of plastic and a dapping ball.

I make a forming die by sketching the shape I need on a piece of thick plastic. Then drill a hole and saw out the shape with a jeweler's saw and a coarse blade. When sawing, try to keep edges straight up and down. Refine the cut as needed with a sanding drum or file. Select a thickness of plastic that is just a little more than the amount of doming you want.



Note: I tend to use 1/4 inch or 3/8 inch plastic that I get as scraps from a local plastics shop.

To use the die, cut a piece of sheet about 3/8 inch wider than the hole in the die on all sides. Anneal the sheet and tape it down on the plastic. Use a dapping ball and hammer to create the domed shape. When the taped down edges begin to warp, planish them flat on the top of the die. Finally, if the sheet is to be domed deeply, you will need to anneal the metal occasionally.

One nice feature of this technique can be seen in the top and left of the picture. If the sawed walls are straight up and down, the hole on the bottom is a mirror image of the hole on the top. This allows you to produce a mirror image shape as needed to make left and right earrings or both sides of an irregular shaped bead as shown.

It details 24 different techniques for adding texture to your jewelry and metal work without the need for heavy equipment like a mill. The techniques make use of more common tools and materials around the shop — like hammers, stamps, punches, and tool bits for the Dremel or Foredom.

Each technique is explained in detail with:

- Description and pictures of the technique
- Procedures for creating the texture
- List of tools and supplies needed
- Options for modifying and personalizing

These methods are both useful and practical. I use them in my own work, and I teach them to others in classes and workshops. What's more is they're practical. None should put a dent in your budget.

Call to order: 6:30 p.m.

- Motioned to approve minutes from May made by Greig Lundergan. Seconded by James Denslow. Approved by all.
- Treasurer report was given by Greig Lundergan. The club made money this month. Should be seeing the money for the Fall Show by next month. All miscellaneous expenses were listed. Treasurer report was motioned to be approved by James Denslow, seconded by Christy Gorrow and approved by all.


