

The next available classes are:



These are two-day classes, part of a three-part series on cutting faceted stones. The following topics will be covered:

- Choosing cutting material
- Stone dopping
- Facet cutting
- Transferring a stone
- Facet polishing
- Proper operation and care of a faceting machine.

Each student will complete a minimum of one stone. Cost: \$230. Cutting material, shop

This is a two-day workshop covering the basics of turning slabs of rocks into polished pieces. The cost of the class is \$230, which includes materials,

instructor fees and shop time. A deposit of \$130 is required to save a spot, and the balance of \$100 should be paid to the instructor the day of the class. You must wear closed-toed shoes. No loose clothing and long hair must be tied back. Bring a waterproof apron, an Optivisor, a large towel and lunch.

Beginning Faceting class



- Nov. 23-24
- Dec. 21-22

This is a two-day class on cutting faceted gemstones (transparent stones similar in appearance to diamonds). You will learn how to choose cutting material, dop the stone, cut and polish facets, transfer a stone, proper operation and care of a faceting machine. Each student will complete one stone.

Cost is \$230 total, which includes materials, instructor fee, club shop time and use of machines. A deposit of \$130 is required to reserve a seat. The balance of \$100 should be paid directly to the instructor on the first day of class.

Each student should have his/her own Optivisor to closely examine the stone during the cutting process. These are available on Amazon or Harbor Freight.

You must wear closed-toed shoes. No loose clothing and long hair must be tied back.

Silversmithing 1.3 class



In the third and final class of the Fundamentals of Silversmithing Course, the student will create a sterling silver pendant featuring a round or oval cabochon. This class consists of two four-hour classes.

9 a.m.-1 p.m. Oct. 26 and Nov. 9

Cost: \$144* Materials and the use of tools are included in the cost. (*Materials cost is subject to change based on market prices.) Deposit of \$52 on Signup Genius required to save a seat. Prerequisite: Must have completed Silver 1.1 and 1.2. Students must bring own Optivisor. Closed-toed shoes required.
