

Remembering Gerri Lundergan

Gerri Lundergan, the absolute love of my life, died Friday evening Feb. 24, 2023, in a tragic auto accident. She had just turned 63, and we were headed toward the best times of our lives together. She will be fondly remembered by all those whose lives she touched, both human and animal alike.

She was raised by her parents, Wayne and Beatrice Kenny, in Chico, California, where her love of horses began. She is an ARIA certified riding instructor. She devoted 45+ years to all things horse: the proper care, training and rehabbing she felt were her life's work. She was a great mentor, teacher and trainer to all. You only needed to want to learn, and she became an open book.

She was a member of the Tampa Bay Mineral & Science Club for over a decade and was President for the past 3+ years. She also was the foreman of the Lapidary department, where she put in the time and effort to become an expert of all things rock. She was considered the club's rock, slab and cab expert. She created amazing wire wrapped jewelry pieces with lapidary cabs, as well as broken china pieces.

Her willingness to share her knowledge (horse, lapidary and life in general) to anyone who was willing to learn, was one of the reasons she was put here on this earth, she firmly believed.

She is survived by her husband Greig Lundergan, her son Cody Gibson, step-daughter and son-in-law Cory & Patrick Cothron, stepdaughter Samantha Lundergan, stepson Justin Lundergan, her Australian Shepherd – SON – Mooch, her grandchildren Jaden, Vanessa and Evan, and her countless friends everywhere. With her passing she is able to join her oldest son Bobby, who also died in a tragic auto accident Feb. 25, 2011.

Her Celebration of Life Ceremony will be held Saturday, April 22 from 2-5pm, at Dun Painted Farm, 4040 Gallagher Road, Plant City, Florida. Everyone affected by this tragedy, any and all, are invited to visit and share your favorite Gerri stories, or just visit with others also deeply affected by her tragic loss of life.




