

With you and your help, our shows would not have grown to the level of success that they have attained!


We expect the Fall Show - Nov. 4-5 - to be a roaring success, and anticipate a guest count in excess of 3,000 adults and kids.

TBMSC Board Meeting Minutes

April 10, 2023

Call to order: 6:36 p.m.

Board members present: Greig Lundergan, Linda Collins (by phone), Lyra Solochek, Yanitza Sendros, Peter Favaro, Christy Gorrow, James Denslow

Non-Board members present: Melinda Riddle

- Yanitza Sendros and Lyra Solochek moved for the previous meeting minutes to be approved. James Denslow and Greig Lundergan seconded the motion. All approved.
- The treasurer's report was given by Greig Lundergan.
- This month's deposits will be erratic because of the club's upcoming classes.
- Spring show made \$35,000 on tables and paid \$30,000 to the Florida State Fair.
- The College Hunk movers fee has been split since some posted in March and some in April.
- Christy Gorrow moved for the treasure's report to be approved. Lyra Solochek and James Denslow second the motion. All approved.
- The Spring Show report was also given by Greig Lundergan
- Concern for the vendors' lunch on Friday was raised. Since the quality of the food given at this show was not good. It lacked some of the main ingredients and the bread was soggy.
- Need to get at least two more tablets before the next show. This will ensure that all cash transactions are also being recorded in the payment system.
- The overall profit was \$17,500. The club received a credit from the State Fair from an overestimation on parking.
- An increase of \$2.00 per table would cover the cost of having the AC on Friday during set up.
- All decisions regarding the increase in price were postponed until after the fair has its board meeting in July.
- Discussion on the vendor grievances: Mainly competing against wholesale and not being on the same spot as the last show.
- Yanitza Sendros asked about charging a premium fee to vendors for them to get their desired spot. Greig Lundergan explained that is not possible since he must ensure a balance of offerings across the different aisles.
- Handicap parking was closer to the building this year. The food at the concession is still questionable.
- Discussion of using different venues followed.
- Discussion of changing the dates for future spring show
- The Fall Show will still be during the first weekend of November.
- Despite all the other events that were going on during the show in the Tampa Bay area, the attendance was approximately the same as last year's Spring Show.
- Peter Favaro suggested that we analyze the trend of spring show attendance vs. fall show attendance to see whether the Spring Show should be smaller.

Other business:

• AC repairs will cost around \$170. Ardys Favaro moved for the repairs to take place. Greig Lundergan second the motion. All approved.

- Peter Favaro talked to T-Mobile about switching our current phone line. We can keep our number and receive two cellphones and unlimited data — which would allow us to use hotspots for internet connection. The total cost will be about the same as we are currently paying for a phone service. However, the plan would also include a year subscription to Microsoft 365, which would allow the club to save the annual cost for subscribing to the software.
- Discussion ensued on what services were connected to the current internet line to make sure the T-Mobile plan will work, ie. ADT security system
- A subscription-based YouTube classes were discussed next and whether at home editing would be fair to the volunteers. Peter Favaro stated that now the club does not have the technical capabilities to support such an endeavor. Until the club can update its equipment, we must rely on volunteers doing the task at home.
- A discussion took place whether a camcorder or a Go-Pro would be better for recording these videos.
- Lyra Solochek volunteered multiple devices to see which of these devices recorded with the best quality.
- A survey will be added to the Geode to ask members for input on the context of the classes.
- Open shop attendance has been low to non-existent in some areas. The might have to adjust the available times.
- Suggestion was made by Peter Favaro that the club may want to do more half-day or full-day workshops to compensate to get more people in the clubhouse.
- The construction bid received by Vail Remodeling and Custom Cabinets LLC. Was reviewed item by item. Greig Lundergan suggested that a revised version of the bid be issued to accommodate the latest changes.
- Lyra Solochek brought up the youth summer programs and asked whether they were going to be happening this year. Discussion ensues on whether it is feasible and can we have them ready for this summer.
- A sign-up genius will be set up for Gerri Lundergan's memorial. Easy finger foods are the goal.
- Greig Lundergan wrote a thank-you note for all the volunteers that helped in the show and it will go out on the issue of the Geode.
- Greig Lundergan and Lyra Solochek moved for the meeting to adjourned. Yanitza Sendros and James Denslow seconded the motion. All approved.
