Students will construct a top inlaid ½-inch cuff (3 styles) using sterling silver sheet, square wire with hard solder and Pripps flux, then add additional side design detail, form and top inlay stone. Students can bring basic silver tools (favorite jewelers saw, forging hammer, rawhide,

Students will construct an Inlay Pendant — two of pendant No. 1 and/or No. 2, or one of pendant No. 3 or No. 4 — using sterling silver sheet, square or triangle wire with hard solder and Pripps flux. For pendant 3 or 4, add side inlay design detail and top inlay stone. Students can bring basic silver tools (favorite jewelers saw, forging hammer, rawhide, etc.), pocket knife or scribe, though all tools needed will be available to use. Students need to bring a



slab or four pieces of tumbled rock to inlay. Bring something that calls you or is exceptional, it makes the pendant. Pattern stones do very well with plain colored stone. There will be rock available, but most people usually have something that is special already. Lunch will be provided by the club.



Lab Fee: Included in cost of the workshop — All Sterling Silver for Project (20 gauge sterling silver sheet, 4 gauge triangle wire or 10 gauge square sterling silver wire, double half round back bail, pendant 3 or 4 have another back plate & lift), all banding silver, titanium solder pick to use, scribe, Pripps flux, silver hard and medium wire solder, saw blades, glues for inlay, color inks for two-part epoxy, stabilizer glues, 3M and black Cratex wheels on Dremel points, green scrubby, pencil and disposable goods. Does include some banding stones and wood.

Prerequisites: Previous silver or soldering experience (very helpful) and Lapidary (cabbing)

Learning the ways of cobblestone inlay

Students spent a weekend in January learning how to create cobblestone inlay pendants with guest instructor Caitlin Albritton. First, they created the framework of the pendant in silver in their own design. Each stone then was cut to fit each compartment and domed separately for a unique texture.


















Pendants in various stages of completion.

LAPIDARY

Time for some saw maintenance

Classes are rolling along and open shop is still available for those who want to do work on your cabochons. Hours are 4-8 p.m. Tuesdays and 9 a.m.-1 p.m. Saturdays. Shop fee is \$6 per

Saw repair and maintenance are in the works, so please be patient if you have rocks being cut. We must do this to ensure that the saws don't break down completely, forcing everyone to wait even longer.

We are also working on a redesign of the lapidary shop and, hopefully we can start the update mid-year. We are looking to make it easier to control the water pressure and also create some more space inside of the shop.

We also installed a new drill press to drill a hole in the stone. We do have a few core drill bits but we only have 2.5mm, so if you want bigger holes you will need to bring your own bits. I recommend hollow-core diamond bits for best results.

Beginning Cabochon class

This is either a two-day workshop or 5-night series covering the basics of turning slabs of rocks into polished pieces. What is intarsia?

We're now scheduling intarsia classes for March.

What is intarsia? In this lapidary art form, you cut thin slices of material and glue them together to create a mosaic-like cabochon. You work from the inside and build outward. Materials used can be gemstone, glass, and man-made composites.

In this class, students will create intricate designs that resemble little framed pictures. Due to the availability of one intarsia machine, only one student can attend at a time. All classes are by appointment only.

Participants must have completed the Beginning Cabochon class, or have equivalent experience (skill check required for a shop pass).

Beginning Faceting classes

This is a two-day class on cutting faceted gemstones (transparent stones similar in appearance to diamonds). You will learn how to choose cutting material, dop the stone, cut and polish facets, transfer a stone, and proper operation and care of a faceting machine. Each student will complete one stone. Cost is \$230 total, which includes materials, instructor fee, club shop time and use of machines. A deposit of \$130 is required to reserve a seat. The balance of \$100 should be paid directly to the instructor on the first day of class. Each student should have his/her own Optivisor to closely examine the stone during the cutting process. These are available on Amazon or Harbor Freight. You must wear closed-toed shoes. No loose clothing and long hair must be tied back.


