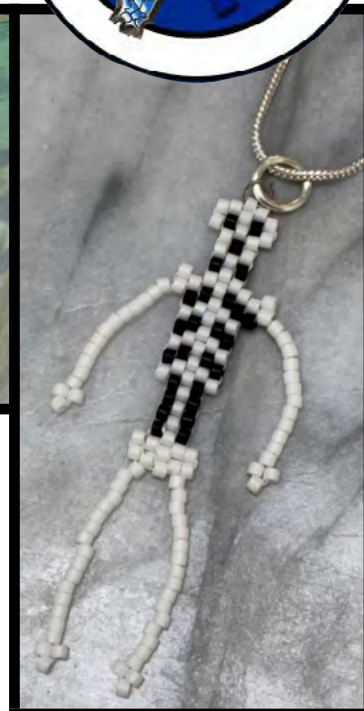

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

What we've accomplished

Dear Members,

The interior renovations are mostly complete, and the club has a whole new look! Our Grand Re-Opening on Sept. 12 was well attended, and it was great to hear so many members say how happy they are with the changes. The new floors and freshly painted walls really brighten up the spaces and give the clubhouse a more modern feel.

Here are some of the highlights:

- **Main Room:** The main room now has a clean, modern look, with new display cabinets for our specimen collection. It will continue to serve as our primary classroom, and I think it makes a great first impression for visitors.
- **Metal Shop:** We renovated the soldering bench and added a fourth station. We've also added or upgraded some equipment for members to use.
- **Faceting Room:** Faceting now has its own dedicated room, away from the distractions of the previous open layout.
- **Metal Clay Area:** We added electrical outlets along the outside wall, giving us more flexibility to set up additional equipment.
- **Second Classroom:** We converted the former faceting area into a second open classroom. This space will be used for smaller table crafts and metal clay classes, and it also houses our club office desk.
- **Dining Area:** We added a dining table for snacks and lunches. Please help us keep food and drinks in this area rather than in the shops.

Of course, we're not done yet! Over the next several months, we'll continue working on improvements around the clubhouse. Some of the items on our to-do list include:

- Adding more storage by placing containers on site
- Re-doing and finishing the back entryway, along with other ADA improvements
- Replacing windows
- Making additional improvements to the lapidary area

I thank all those who pitched in. In addition to our board members, I thank all those you showed up regularly to help: Russ Hislip, his wife Cindy, and his daughter Heather; Elizabeth Creamer and her son Gabe and Gabe's friend Chris; Nancy Polis; and Ken Moser. And a special "thank you" to my husband Jeff and daughter Yoko who are often "volun-told" to help.

November Show

The Fall Show is coming up fast — November 7–8, with setup on November 6. We'll be hosting more than 60 vendors at the Florida State Fairgrounds Special Events Center.

If you're not familiar with our shows, the club hosts two Gem, Mineral and Jewelry Shows each year, and they are two of our major fundraisers. They are completely volunteer-run, so the success of the shows depends on our members pitching in.

USFG Faceting Meetup

TBMS is partnering with the United States Faceting Guild (USFG) for a "Meetpoint Meetup" — a gathering where faceters can cut the same material and work on the same design together.

This is a free event sponsored by the USFG and is open to faceters who have already cut several stones on their own, since some experience is required. Participants will need to bring their own equipment and supplies needed to facet a stone.

This will be the first meetup of this kind in Florida, and we're excited to host it at TBMS. It's a great opportunity to bring faceters together, introduce more people to our club, and showcase what we



have to offer as a faceting destination.

Membership Prorating

I believe our membership offers a lot of value for what we provide — a great facility, well-equipped workshops, knowledgeable instructors, and, of course, the wonderful camaraderie that makes this club special.

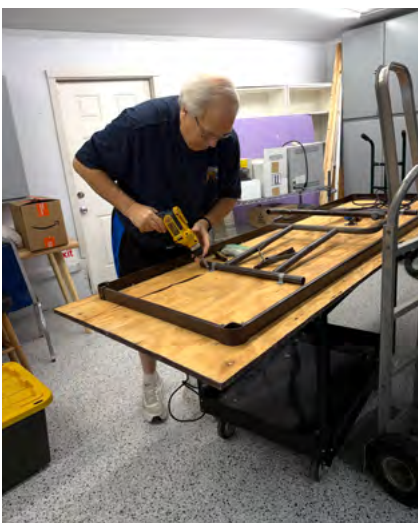
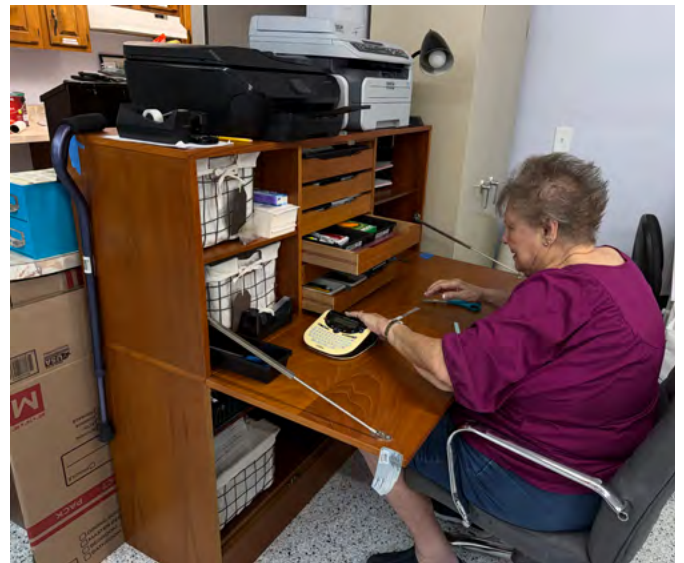

FACETING: MEETPOINT MEETUP

January 9-10, 2027

USFG Meetpoint Meetup coming to club!



Meetpoint Meetup in Franklin, North Carolina, in July.

Experienced faceters, take note. We are working with the United States Faceting Guild to host our own Meetpoint Meetup at the Tampa Bay Mineral and Science Club. The event will take place Saturday-Sunday, January 9-10, 2027, with a setup/arrival on Friday, January 8.

You must have your own faceting machine, and must have cut 20-30 stones on your own. You also must know how to use your machine, as we will not have time to troubleshoot during the sessions.

The event itself is free, but attendees must arrange their own transportation and accommodations. The event is open to any USFG member, and club membership is not required.

This is the first time the USFG is having a Meetpoint Meetup in Florida, so this is exciting news. We expect this event will put the TBMSC on the map as a faceting destination.

Learn how to create your own X-cube

Bonus session in conjunction with the Meetup: We're working with glass artist Cody Rosenberg of Atlanta who is willing to teach how to create an X-cube from scratch.

What is an X-cube? The material, also known as dichroic cube, was originally created as an optical element of projection and display systems. It contains internal laminated dichroic film that reflects and transmits light, combining or separating RGB color. When faceted, the results are amazing.



Cody, who has 8 years of hands-on glass faceting experience, will show us the different stages of the process so students can see how he takes an original block of glass to the finished cube. He will also demonstrate faceting an X cube.

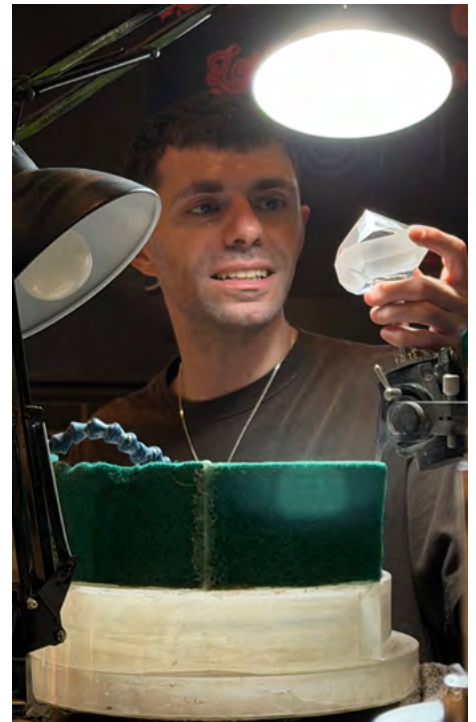
A little about what students would be getting from the class:

- Instructions on a tested, repeatable process for both glass lamination and faceting
- An up-close, small-group demon-

stration with plenty of time for questions

- Explanation of not only how he does each step, but why it works
- Continued mentorship after the event
- Access to his educator discount for qualifying lapidary equipment and supplies

The class will be a 3- to 3.5-hour session on Friday evening before the Meetpoint Meetup. Class fee will be \$100. Signup details to be announced soon.

Faceting classes remain popular

- 9 a.m.-3 p.m. September 5-6
- 9 a.m.-3 p.m. October 3-4
- 9 a.m.-3 p.m. December 19-20

This is a two-day class on cutting faceted gemstones (transparent stones similar in appearance to diamonds). You will learn how to choose cutting material, dop the stone, cut and polish facets, transfer a stone, and properly operate and care for a faceting machine. Each student will complete one stone.

Cost is \$230 total, which includes materials, instructor fee, club shop time and use of machines. A deposit of \$130 is required to reserve a seat. The balance of \$100 should be paid directly to the instructor on the first day of class.

Each student should have his/her own Optivisor to closely examine the stone during the cutting process. These are available on Amazon or Harbor Freight. You must wear closed-toed shoes. No loose clothing, and long hair must be tied back.

New series for Fundamentals of Silver begins in October

The club is reorganizing the Fundamentals of Silver course, and we're almost ready to begin our first series.

October 17, 9 a.m.-4 p.m.

Silversmithing 1.1

In this introductory metalsmithing class, students will become familiar with the torch bench and other equipment used throughout the course, including hand tools, sanders, flex shafts, and chemicals. Safety is a key part of the class, with instruction on proper procedures and safe operation of all equipment in the metal shop.

Students will then put their skills into practice with two hands-on projects. The first project introduces basic hand sawing using a selected pattern, followed by cutting, sanding, and attaching a simple bail and chain. The second project focuses on creating a simple ring band, including cutting and sanding wire and adding a pattern to the ring before the final sanding.

Cost: \$138 (\$38 shop fee to reserve a seat, balance of \$100 to instructor on the day of class. Material cost may be adjusted due to change in market pricing.)

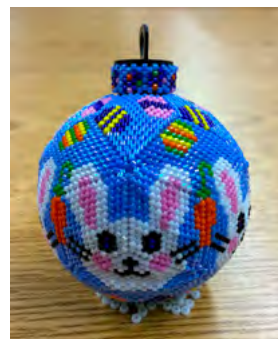

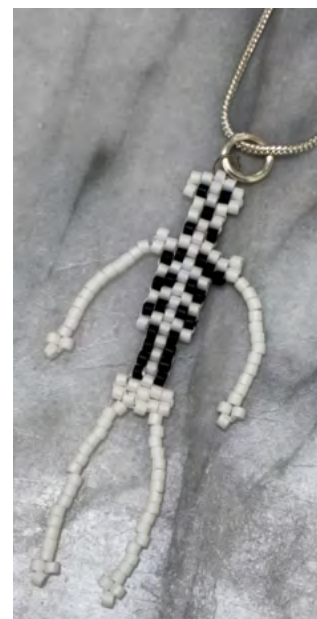

Beginner's Wire Weaving

If you have completed your Intermediate Wire Wrapping Class and are ready for the next challenge, this is for you! Challenge yourself with Advanced Wire Wrapping (some call it Wire Weaving). In this class you will be working with several wires creating a weave or wrapping design shapes for the cabochon you have selected. The bale will be created with the continuous weave brought over the back to create and capture the entire cabochon.

All materials will be included in the class fee. Tools available on loan if needed. Bring your own magnifiers. Closed toed shoes are required. Go to Sign Up Genius, reserve a seat by placing a deposit for the shop fees. Balance paid to Instructor on class day.

This two-day class begins on the morning of Day 1 with an introduction to wax carving, where you'll create a freeform ring. In the afternoon, you'll learn how to set up a plaster of Paris mold. This mold will be placed in the kiln at the

end of the day for burnout overnight.

On Day 2, you'll cast your ring in sterling silver and explore various methods to finish and polish your piece. Previous experience in silver classes is strongly recommended.

The fee for the class is \$250, which includes all materials, instructor fee, and shop time. A deposit of \$150 is required to reserve your spot, with the remaining \$100 payable to the instructor on the day of the class.

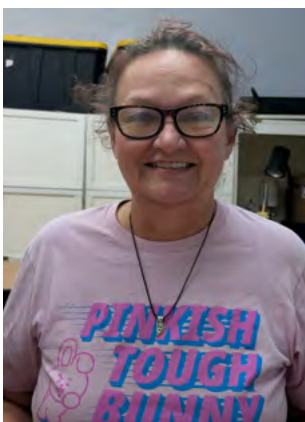


how to torch fire!

Brad's Bench Tips

Find the balance point

With odd-shaped pendants or earrings it's often difficult to find the right place to attach a bail or loop so that the piece is balanced and hangs straight. A quick way to make a tool for this is to modify a set of tweezers.

Any set of tweezers will work. Spread the tips, sharpen them with a file, and bend the tips at a right angle to point toward each other.

To use the tool, suspend the pendant or earring between two sharp points to see if it hangs straight.

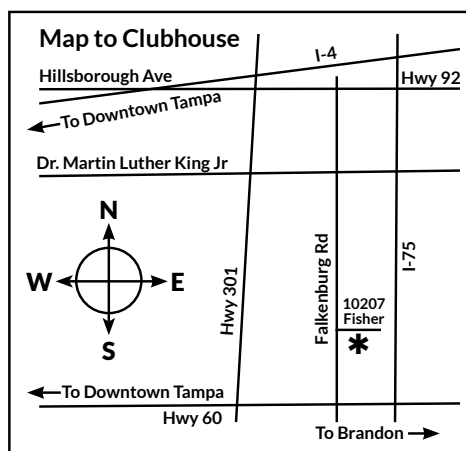
