

We're just a week away from classes by guest instructor Chuck Bruce. And we still have a few seats available in the knife inlay class!


Chuck is a well known artist who teaches at various schools across the country, including William Holland Lapidary School in Georgia where his classes are sold out. He has been making jewelry for 19 years, with extensive knowledge in cabochons, chain making, chasing & repousse, cold connections, design, fold forming, gold, granulation, lost wax casting, mokume-gane, opals, inlay, intarsia, silver, spool knitting & steel tools.

Feb. 17-18

Silver inlay —FULL

The first class is Silver Inlay from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Feb. 17-18, where you will focus on silver inlay cuffs. Students should bring or purchase 2 to 3 slabs of rock that are of similar hardness that can be combined for inlay. Patterned stones do well with plain colored stone. Students can also inlay with wood, fossil ivory, bone, Fordite. Experience in silver and lapidary are required to take this class.

Knife inlay SEATS STILL AVAILABLE

The second class is Knife Inlay from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Feb. 19-20. Students will work on two Texas Toothpick knives. Students need to bring two slabs of rock or several pieces of tumbled rock to inlay. Bring something that calls you or that's exceptional; it makes the knife. Patterned stones do very well with plain colored stones. There will be rock available but most people usually have something that is special already.



COST: \$420, which includes workshop fee, club shop time, student kit, lunch, instructor expenses and registration fee. Chuck will have extra knives (blanks) for sale.

If club cabbing stations are full, we can offer two additional seats using Chuck's cabbing machines. These seats will be an additional \$50 to use his equipment.



Here are dates for upcoming classes:


- March 23-24




Beginning Silver students created spinner rings as part of their nine-week course.

Brad's Bench Tips

Testing for silver

Often you need to identify some of those unknown "silvery" pieces of metal in the bottom of the toolbox or some piece of old jewelry that is not hallmarked. Is it silver or is it something else?

Of course, if you need to know exactly what you have, it's best to send your metals off for refining. But inexpensive silver testing solutions can be used to help distinguish higher silver content alloys from alloys that have the same appearance but with little to no silver content, like German Silver or Nickel.

I purchased a half-ounce bottle of JSP Silver Testing Solution #GT41. It's not a rigorous analytic test, but it lets you know if you're on the right track. And it's inexpensive. Mine was only \$3.

With a fresh solution you have an instant reaction after applying it to the metal being tested. The procedure is simple - apply a small drop and watch for a color change. Note that the acid will leave a slight mark, so choose a spot that is out of the way or will be easy to polish.

If you suspect the object is silver plated, you should file a little notch somewhere inconspicuous to expose what metal is below the surface. Otherwise, all you test will be the surface plating.

Here's the reaction I got when testing various materials:

Finesilver	Red/Orange
Sterling silver	Brick Red
80% silver 20% copper	Dark red changing to gray
Brass	Yellow changing to blue
Nicke	Gray-green
Copper	Yellow changing to blue
Steel	Black
Stainless Steel	No color change

Caution: If you do any of this testing, know that you are handling a reasonably strong acid. The GT41 label says it includes nitric acid and potassium dichromate.

- Wear safety glasses.
- Do not get any testing solution on your skin.
- Use a solution of baking soda and water to neutralize acid.
- Wash and clean up well when you're done.



"24 Easy Metal Textures" -With No Rolling Mill Required

It details 24 different techniques for adding texture to your jewelry and metal work without the need for heavy equipment like a mill. The techniques make use of more common tools and materials around the shop — like hammers, stamps, punches, and tool bits for the Dremel or Foredom.

Each technique is explained in detail with:

- Description and pictures of the technique
- Procedures for creating the texture
- List of tools and supplies needed
- Options for modifying and personalizing

These methods are both useful and practical. I use them in my own work, and I teach them to others in classes and workshops. What's more is they're practical. None should put a dent in your budget.


