

## **President's message**





# Inlay workshops with Chuck Bruce

We are thrilled to announce that guest instructor Chuck Bruce is coming to the club to teach two inlay workshops in February.

Chuck is a well known artist who teaches at various schools across the country, including William Holland Lapidary School in Georgia. He has been making jewelry for 19 years, with extensive knowledge in cabochons, chain making, chasing & repousse, cold connections, design, fold forming, gold, granulation, lost wax casting, mokume-gane, opals, inlay, intarsia, silver, spool knitting & steel tools.

#### **Silver inlay**

The first class is Silver Inlay from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Feb. 17-18, where you will focus on silver inlay cuffs. Students should bring or purchase 2 to 3 slabs of rock that are of similar hardness that can be combined for inlay. Patterned stones do well with plain colored stone. Students can also inlay with wood, fossil ivory, bone, Fordite. Experience in silver and lapidary are required to take this class.

**COST:** \$410, which includes workshop fee, club shop time, student kit, lunch, instructor expenses and registration fee.

The Silver Inlay class is already full. But if you'd like to be on a wait list in case of a cancellation, please contact Kathy Reid at <u>kathyjoreid@verizon.net</u>.





#### Knife inlay

The second class is Knife Inlay from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Feb. 19-20. Students will work on two Texas Toothpick knives. Students need to bring two slabs of rock or several pieces of tumbled rock to inlay. Bring something that calls

you or that's exceptional; it makes the knife. Patterned stones do very well with plain colored stones. There will be rock available but most people usually have something that is special already.

CÓST: \$410, which includes workshop fee, club shop time, student kit, lunch, instructor expenses and registration fee. Chuck will have extra knives (blanks) for sale.



If club cabbing stations are full, we can offer two additional seats using Chuck's cabbing machines. These seats will be an additional \$50 to use his equipment.

## **Brad's Bench Tips**

#### **Transparent cabs**

When bezel setting a transparent cabochon in silver, I usually cut out the back of the bezel to allow background light to show off the colors and patterns in the stone. If this is not possible or appropriate, I worry that the silver bezel will tarnish under the stone and will ruin its brilliance. What to do?

My solution is one extra step before setting the stone. I place a piece of thin silver Mylar plastic under the stone to act as a mirror that will never tarnish. Mylar is readily available in craft and gift wrap stores, or in a pinch from a party balloon supplier. You may even want to experiment with using colored or patterned Mylar (i.e. diffraction pattern) under some stones.



#### "24 Easy Metal Textures" - With No Rolling Mill Required

It details 24 different techniques for adding texture to your jewelry and metal work without the need for heavy equipment like a mill. The techniques make use of more common tools and materials around the shop — like hammers, stamps, punches, and tool bits for the Dremel or Foredom. Each technique is explained in detail with:

- Description and pictures of the technique
- Procedures for creating the texture
- List of tools and supplies needed
- Options for modifying and personalizing

These methods are both useful and practical. I use them in my own work, and I teach them to others in classes and workshops. What's more is they're practical. None should put a dent in your budget.
