FACETING

Beginning Faceting class

- **June 28-29, 2025**



This is a two-day class on cutting faceted gemstones (transparent stones similar in appearance to diamonds). You will learn how to choose cutting material, dop the stone, cut and polish facets, transfer a stone, and proper operation and care of a faceting machine. Each student will complete one stone.

Cost is \$230 total, which includes materials, instructor fee, club shop time and use of machines. A deposit of \$130 is required to reserve a seat. The balance of \$100 should be paid directly to the instructor on the first day of class.

Each student should have his/her own Optivisor to closely examine the stone during the cutting process. These are available on Amazon or Harbor Freight.

You must wear closed-toed shoes. No loose clothing and long hair must be tied back.

Silversmithing 1.1: Introduction to Silversmithing

- **9 a.m. to 2 p.m. July 12**



The first class of the Fundamentals of Silversmithing Course is a five-hour class where the student will create a textured sterling silver ring band. The basics of metalsmithing will be covered, including shop etiquette and safety, how to use jewelry tools, soldering, finishing. Cost: \$78*

Materials and the use of tools are included in the cost. (*Materials cost is subject to change based on market prices.) Deposit of \$33 on SignUp Genius required to reserve a seat. Pay the balance of \$45 to the instructor. Students must bring own Optivisor. Closed-toed shoes required. No loose clothing; long hair must be tied back. This is a two-day workshop covering the basics of turning slabs of rocks into polished pieces. The cost of the class is \$230, which includes materials, instructor fees and shop time. A deposit of \$130 is required to save a spot, and the balance of \$100 should be paid to the instructor the day of the class.

You must wear closed-toed shoes. No loose clothing and long hair must be tied back. Bring a waterproof apron, an Optivisor, a large towel and lunch.

Brad's Bench Tips

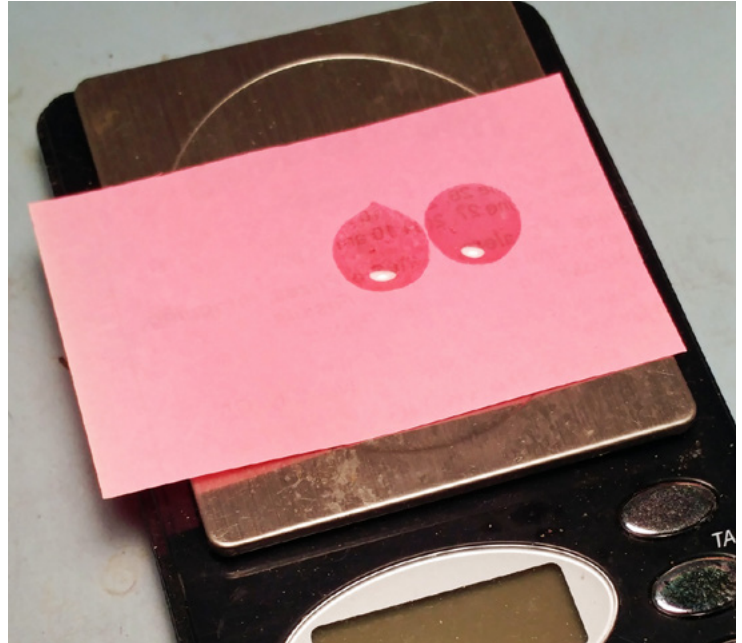

MIXING EPOXIES

When mixing two-part epoxy, it's very important to have the same amount of each component. If the ratio is not 50:50, the mixture will not develop the best strength or may not harden at all.

If the amounts are small, I can generally eye-ball the two components correctly. But I have trouble getting the proper mixture for larger quantities. The easiest way I've found is to use a gram scale.

- Put a bottle lid or piece of scrap paper on the scale.
- Zero out the scale.
- Squeeze out the epoxy Part A.
- Note the gram weight.
- Zero out the scale again.
- Squeeze out the same amount of Part B.
- Mix thoroughly for use.



"24 Easy Metal Textures" - With No Rolling Mill Required

It details 24 different techniques for adding texture to your jewelry and metal work without the need for heavy equipment like a mill. The techniques make use of more tools and materials around the shop — like hammers, stamps, punches and tool bits for the Dremel or Foredom.

Each technique is explained in detail with:

- Description and pictures of the technique
- Procedures for creating the texture
- List of tools and supplies needed
- Options for modifying and personalizing

These methods are both useful and practical. I use them in my own work, and I teach them to others in classes and workshops. What's more is they're practical. None should put a dent in your budget.

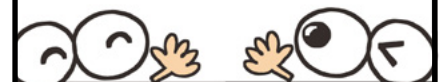

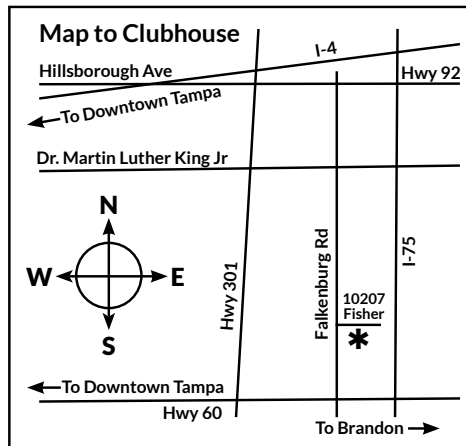
