Introducing prepaid cards for frequent open-shoppers







Do you want to avoid the hassle of paying for open shop each time you visit? You can buy Prepaid Shop Cards (PSC) and use them as you visit the club. Write "PSC" under payment when you sign into Metal, Lapidary or Faceting Open Shops, then present your card to the monitor who will punch out the number of hours used.

The cards will come in three price points:

From the quartz-rich hills of Arkansas to the sapphire streams of Montana, club members spent the summer chasing treasures across the country. IDAHO — Opal mining

Club member Michelle Wacker shared her experiences at the <u>Spencer Opal Mines</u> in Idaho. She learned about this mine earlier this year, and she says she's "hooked!"

The mine has been in operation since 1941 and sits near the Continental Divide in Idaho, about 70 miles west of Yellowstone National Park.

At Spencer Opal Mine, you can find white opal (the most common), yellow opal, and the most coveted — the rare pink opal.

Michelle is already planning a return visit for next digging season, which begins in May. Spencer has a limited number of spots for mining digs. If you want to join her in a dig, make sure to make your reservations on the <u>Spencer website</u>. Deposit is \$45 and the balance of \$350 is due the day of the dig.







You must be a current member to use club facilities. Cost is \$6 per hour. **PayPal, credit card or exact change only.** Please pay the shop monitor or club staff.

Let's review the Lapidary Shop rules

- You must be a member, and have a shop pass (by completing a Beginning Cabochon class, or with shop foreman approval.)
- All members must sign in and sign out when using the Shop.
- Loose clothing, long hair, ties, dangling jewelry, scarves, etc., must be secured or tied up to prevent them from being caught in rotating machines. Closed-toe shoes only. No sandals.
- Three-cab limit per day.
- Dop sticks stay in the shop. Do not take them home with you.
- Cabs must be preformed on the metal wheels with no sharp edges before going to the resin wheels 280 and up. This is to prevent them from getting gouged and ruined.
- Make sure you work the cabs through the grits in sequence. Finish one level completely before moving on.
- Nothing harder than 7.5 on the Mohs scale. No rubies or corundum.
- Only work on stones, crystals or glass. No metal, wood, ceramics, resin, amber or plastic.
- Prohibited Materials: Pyrite, Psilomelane, shells and bones, Bumblebee Jasper, and other toxic or radioactive materials. Fossilized shells are allowed. When in doubt, ask the monitor or instructor.
- The diamond grinding wheels are not to be used for large rock; they are for cabochon grinding use only
- The shop is for personal projects only. No commercial or mass production.
- Do not bring a batch of cabs for polishing only
- Clean the work area after use. The last 15 minutes before the end of your session should be dedicated to cleaning up.
- Harassment, intimidation, or any disruptive behavior is not tolerated.
- Violating these shop rules, repeatedly misusing equipment or ignoring instructor/ monitor warnings may result in suspension or permanent banishment from the Lapidary Shop.

Brad's Bench Tips

By Bradford Smith

Straightening wire

Have you ever reached for your silver wire only to find that it's all bent up? The easiest way I've found to straighten it out is to stretch it a bit.

Simply put one end in the bench vise and grab the other end with a pair of serrated-tip pliers. Then pull just enough to feel the wire stretch like a rubber band. This works best on smaller wire diameters, up to about 16 gauge.

Be careful if you are trying to pull hard on a thick wire. Brace yourself in case the wire breaks or pulls out of the pliers



"24 Easy Metal Textures" - With No Rolling Mill Required

It details 24 different techniques for adding texture to your jewelry and metal work without the need for heavy equipment like a mill. The techniques make use of more tools and materials around the shop — like hammers, stamps, punches and tool bits for the Dremel or Foredom.

Each technique is explained in detail with:

- Description and pictures of the technique
- Procedures for creating the texture
- List of tools and supplies needed
- Options for modifying and personalizing

These methods are both useful and practical. I use them in my own work, and I teach them to others in classes and workshops. What's more is they're practical. None should put a dent in your budget.


