## **WISHING YOU ALL A BLESSED HOLY EASTER**

In the Catholic Church the traditional greeting on Easter morning is "Christ is risen" to which the response is "He is risen indeed. Alleluia!" This ancient phrase echoes the greeting of the angel to Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of James and Joseph as they arrived at the sepulchre to anoint the body of Jesus: "He is not here; for he has risen, as he said" (Matt 28:6). In the Eastern Orthodox the greeting is "Christ is Risen!" To which is respond is "Truly He is Risen!" (Khristós anésti! – Alithós anésti!)
