

THANKYOU BISHOP EMERITUS TERENCE PATRICK DRAINEY WELCOME BISHOP MARCUS STOCK



With appointment of Bishop Marcus Stock, Bishop of Leeds, as Apostolic Administrator of the Diocese of Middlesbrough there will no doubt be a number of questions in relation to his new role. Fr Peter Taylor (Judicial Vicar and Chancellor of our Diocese) provide us with these answers:

What is an Apostolic Administrator? There are numerous different types of Apostolic Administrator, however in our situation an Apostolic Administrator is a priest or a bishop who has been appointed by the Pope to govern a diocese when the Diocesan Bishop retires, resigns or dies. This is different from a Diocesan Administrator who is chosen by the College of Consultors (Chapter of Canons) to govern the diocese on a temporary basis until a new Diocesan Bishop is chosen by the Pope. An Apostolic Administrator governs the diocese for as long as the Pope wishes.


How is it different from a Diocesan Bishop? For all intents and purposes an Apostolic Administrator is like the Diocesan Bishop, he has all the rights and responsibilities of the Diocesan Bishop, however he exercises his office based on the mandate given to him by the Pope. Bishop Marcus does not formally have the title as the Bishop of the Middlesbrough, but he has all the rights and responsibilities the Bishop of Middlesbrough would have.

What does this mean for the Diocese? The Diocese of Middlesbrough continues to function as a separate Diocese, as it did under Bishop Terry, this does not mean that we are immediately merged with the Diocese of Leeds. It is like two parishes which share a priest, both remain as they were before. It does mean that Bishop Marcus will divide his time between Middlesbrough Diocese and Leeds Diocese so there may be some practical changes to allow him to minister to both dioceses.

What does it mean for Bishop Terry? Bishop Terry retired from his role as Diocesan Bishop, with immediate effect, and becomes an emeritus bishop of the diocese, like Bishop John.

Will there be a Mass of Installation? No, there is no need for Bishop Marcus to be installed as he assumed his office from the moment the Holy Father appointed him. However, there will be a Mass to formally welcome Bishop Marcus to the Diocese at some point in the future.

When will we know more about how this arrangement will work? It is very early to know how a lot of things will work practically for this new situation, especially as Bishop Marcus remains Bishop of Leeds with all his responsibilities for that role, overtime things will become a lot clearer how the diocese will continue to function and what the future will hold for both the dioceses of Middlesbrough and Leeds.



EPIPHANY BLESSING FOR THE NEW YEAR CHALKING OF THE DOORS & HOME BLESSING

There is a centuries-old Christian tradition (mainly in Eastern Europe), where the faithful mark the entrance to their homes with a symbol of faith, asking God's blessing upon those who live in, work in, or visit it throughout the coming year. The symbolism of the message is as follows: [first two digits of the year] + C + M + B + [the last two digits of the year]. The "C", "M", & "B" stand for the names of the three Magi: Caspar, Melchior & Balthazar, and the "+" represents the cross. These letters also abbreviate the Latin phrase, **Christus Mansionem Benedicat** meaning "May Christ bless this house." A short prayer may be said as you write the inscription in white chalk.

Prayer: Peace be to this house, and to all who enter here. Amen. Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless our home and all who inhabit it. May we be blessed with health, goodness of heart, gentleness and the keeping of your law. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our love for each other may go out to all. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen
