VISIT OF THE FATIMA STATUE AND THE RELICS OF Ss JACINTA & FRANCISCO

On the 7th June, our Cathedral in Middlesbrough will welcome the statue of the Immaculate Heart of Mary (Fatima) and the relics of Ss Jacinta and Francisco. The visit is organised by the World Apostolate of Fatima. The day will include a Marian Procession and Mass led by Bishop Terry (10am), followed by the veneration of the relics, rosary, lunch, Fatima talk and film, enrolment and Investiture of the Brown Scapular, Holy Hour & Divine Mercy Chaplet (2:50pm), Benediction. The day finish at 4pm. Everyone invited to attend.



National Ecumenical Pilgrimage in York: Wednesday, 18th June 2025 at 2 pm.

The late Holy Father, Pope Francis, gave this Jubilee Year the title "Pilgrims of Hope", and, as sisters and brothers in Christ, we are coming together in the historic pilgrimage site of York Minster to renew



our baptismal promises as fellow Christians on the pilgrimage of unity. On Wednesday, 18th June 2025, at 2 pm, we will gather at the south door of York Minster. There we will wait as the Archbishop of York and the Bishop of Middlesbrough walk together from the shrine of St Margaret Clitheroe towards the Minster. When they arrive, we all enter together into York Minster for a service celebrating our common baptism and reaffirming our baptismal commitment to hope and unity. The service will end around 3.30 pm and there be refreshments afterwards.

Celebrating 10 years of Laudato Si

In May 2015, Pope Francis wrote his encyclical, Laudato Si, and we began a journey of hope, prayer and action for the Care of our Common Home. Pope Francis reminded us in Laudato Si that 'leaving an inhabitable planet to future generations is first and foremost up to us' and that 'living our vocation to be protectors of God's handiwork is not a side project but a core interest for the faithful.'

We ask ourselves, 'How can I live this vocation more fully in my daily actions? To mark ten years of Laudato Si and to honour the legacy of Pope Francis, let's commit

to one or more concrete change this week and in the weeks ahead:

- Reduce single-use plastic
- Rethink fast fashion
- Reduce car use by walking or cycling more
- Plant native herbs or flowers
- Support ethical, local producers
- Campaign for an end to fossil fuel use with a just transition for workers

Let's live Laudato Si together with courage, compassion, and care for God's Creation.
