SEASON OF CREATION 2025 LET'S BE PILGRIMS OF HOPE IN THIS JUBILEE YEAR

As part of this year's Season of Creation, our Justice and Peace Group is looking at how the global debt crisis is affecting poorer countries and the poorest people in those countries. And what we can do about it. The debt Garden of Peace crisis and the climate crisis are closely related and mutually reinforcing.



Instead of developing resilience to the climate crisis, poorer nations are trapped in endless cycles of debt to the richer countries. Twenty-five years after the historic Jubilee 2000 debt campaign, Pope Francis pronounced 2025 as the Jubilee Year of Hope with a powerful demand: the cancellation of unjust and unpayable debt. "More than a question of generosity," he wrote. "It is a matter of justice." He urged wealthy nations to 'acknowledge the gravity of so many of their past decisions and determine to forgive the debts of countries that will never be able to repay them."

As pilgrims of hope in this Jubilee Year, we demand debt justice and transformative financial reforms to bring renewed hope to communities burdened by unsustainable debt. It is a crisis we cannot ignore. The lives of our brothers and sisters are being devastated by debt. Over 54 countries are now facing a debt crisis, with 46% of their debt owned by private creditors, which is slowing – if not completely hampering – development and climate action. 3.3 million people live in countries forced to spend more on payments to big banks, wealthy nations and global institutions than they spend on health, education or life-saving climate measures. Debts are being paid at the expense of hiring doctors and teachers, building schools, hospitals and sewage systems, preparing for floods or coping with droughts. Often, countries have already repaid their debts once, but due to unscrupulous lenders and extortionate interest rates, they are often left paying for the original debt many times over. The global financial system pushes low-income countries into borrowing money at extortionate interest rates, keeping them in a vicious cycle that makes it impossible to clear the debt. The consequences of this are that families forego medical care, children lose access to quality education, and small farmers face the devastating impacts of climate change without support. We need to cancel unfair debts, build better financial systems and implement fairer laws to prevent future debt crises.

And the time to act is now in this Jubilee Year, which is when the Bible calls for debt cancellation to restore justice and human dignity. During this Jubilee Year, people across the world are uniting in solidarity to demand action on the debt crisis. In the words of Cardinal Tarcisius Kikuchi, President of Caritas Internationalis, "Debt is not just an economic burden – it is a moral crisis. The Jubilee tradition calls us to act with compassion, restoring hope to those oppressed by debt. As we enter the Jubilee Year, we must transform debt into opportunities for justice and renewal."

The Caritas Internationalis campaign 'Turn Debt into Hope' is calling for:

- 1. The immediate cancellation and restructuring of unjust and unsustainable debts, without imposing harmful economic policy conditions that fall on the poorest.
- 2. Long-term financial reform that prioritises people and the planet, creating systems that are fair, sustainable and free from predatory lending practices.
- 3. The creation of a global debt framework based on solidarity and harmony between peoples.

Cancel debt, choose hope', is a linked campaign led by a coalition of UK-based organisations, including CAFOD, Christian Aid, Debt Justice UK and Debt4Climate UK. Around 30 UK organisations signed a joint statement urging the UK government to take action on debt relief.

Some suggested actions for our parishes:

- 1. In the spirit of the Jubilee year, demand debt justice. On your way out after our Vigil and Sunday Masses, stop to sign CAFOD's 'Cancel Debt, Choose Hope in this Jubilee Year' petition to send a clear, united message to global leaders, creditors and decision makers to act with courage and compassion.
- 2. Find out more about the debt crisis on cafod.org.uk/cancel the debt.
- 3. Ask your MP to support the call for debt relief for low-income climate vulnerable countries and call for the UK government to contribute its fair share of grant-based climate finance to the New Collective Quantified Goal on Climate Finance (NCQG). Suggested question for your MP: 'The climate and debt crisis are deeply interconnected, with 93% of the most climate vulnerable countries also facing a debt crisis, meaning that funds they could be spending on tackling this climate change are instead going to big banks or rich countries. Will you support the call to the UK government for debt relief for low-income climate vulnerable countries and will you call on the government to commit to contributing its fair share of grant-based, new and additional money to the New Collective Quantified Goal on Climate Finance – particularly following its aid cuts?'
- 4. Say this prayer of intercession: We pray for the world, and particularly for those in the poorest countries who are burdened by the new global debt crisis. In this Jubilee Year, may God grant world leaders and each of us, the wisdom and compassion to take action to enable all people to flourish. Lord in your mercy, hear our prayer.

THE CATHOLIC NONVIOLENCE INITIATIVE (CNI) - is a global movement, a project of Pax Christi International, that promotes active, Gospel-based nonviolence as a core principle for the Catholic Church and society. It advocates for peaceful alternatives to conflict, addresses systemic injustices like racism and ecological destruction, and works to integrate nonviolent practices into the Church's teachings, pastoral care, and social activism. Catholic Non-Violence Days of Action will run from 21st September (International Day of Peace) to 2nd October (International Day of Nonviolence) and tied into the World Week for Peace in Palestine and Israel and the Season of Creation. They offer an opportunity for people around the world to come together in solidarity to promote and celebrate nonviolence. Details and resources for prayer and action on:
