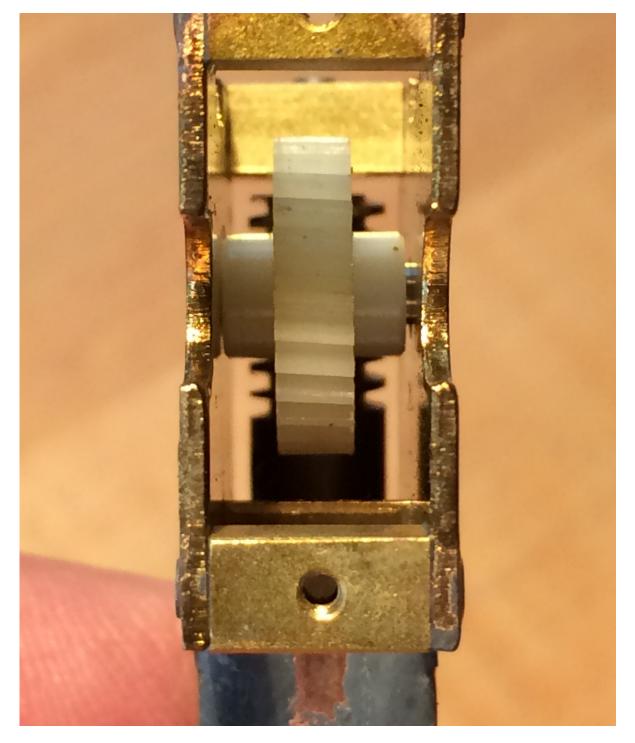


Nice pilot on this model.

The class lamps, headlight and smokebox front will be drilled out for light bulbs and wire routing.





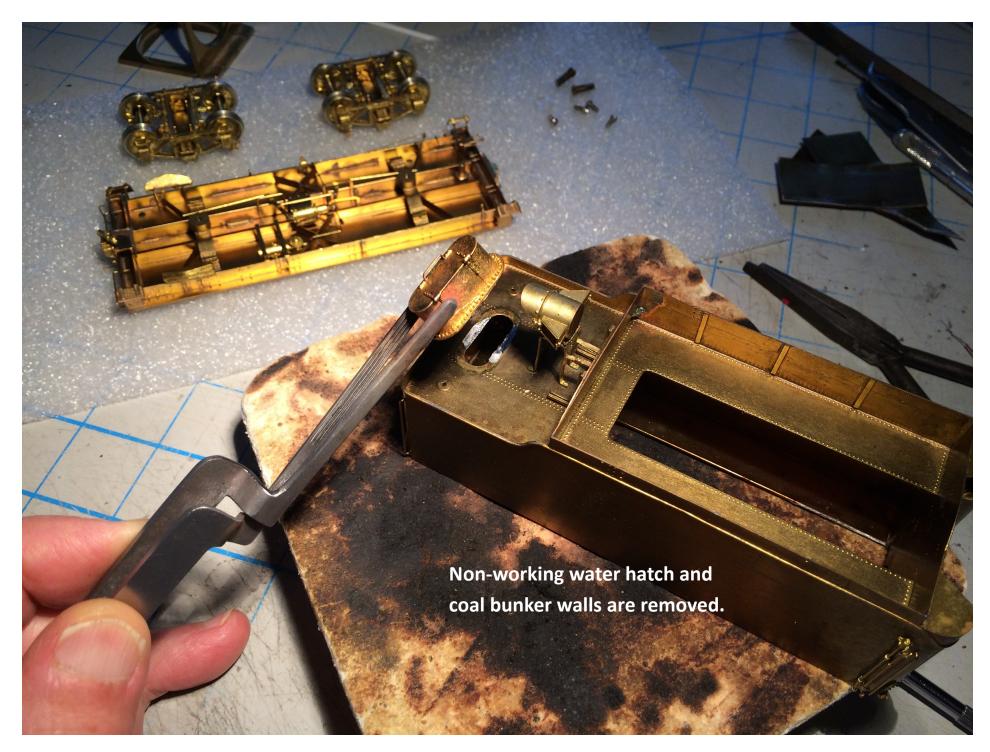


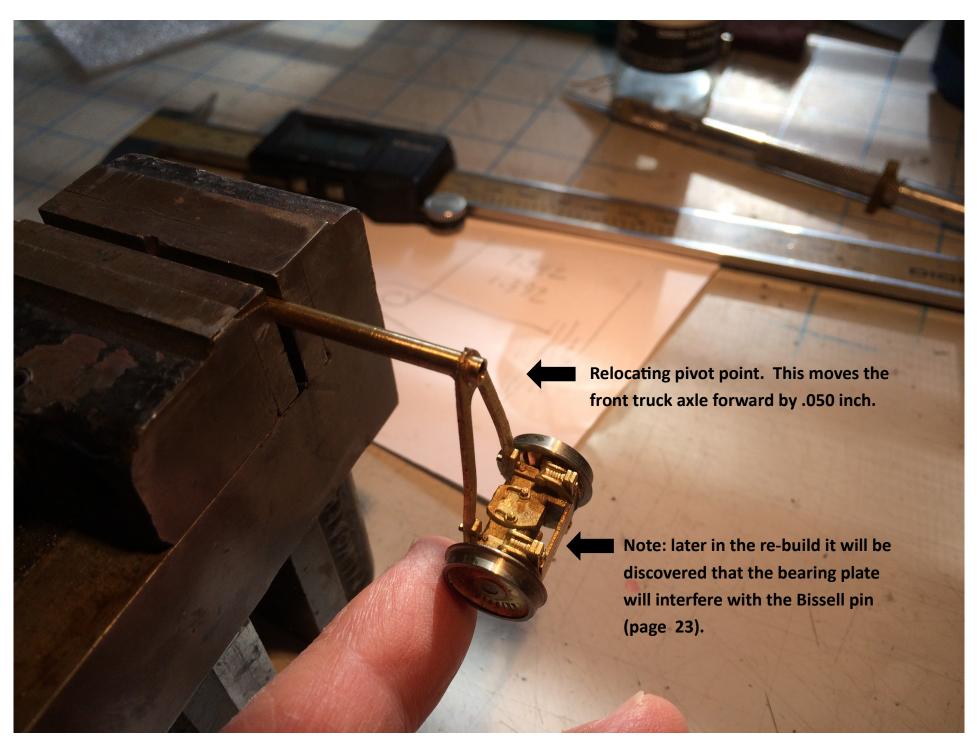
Fitted with thin profile idler gear

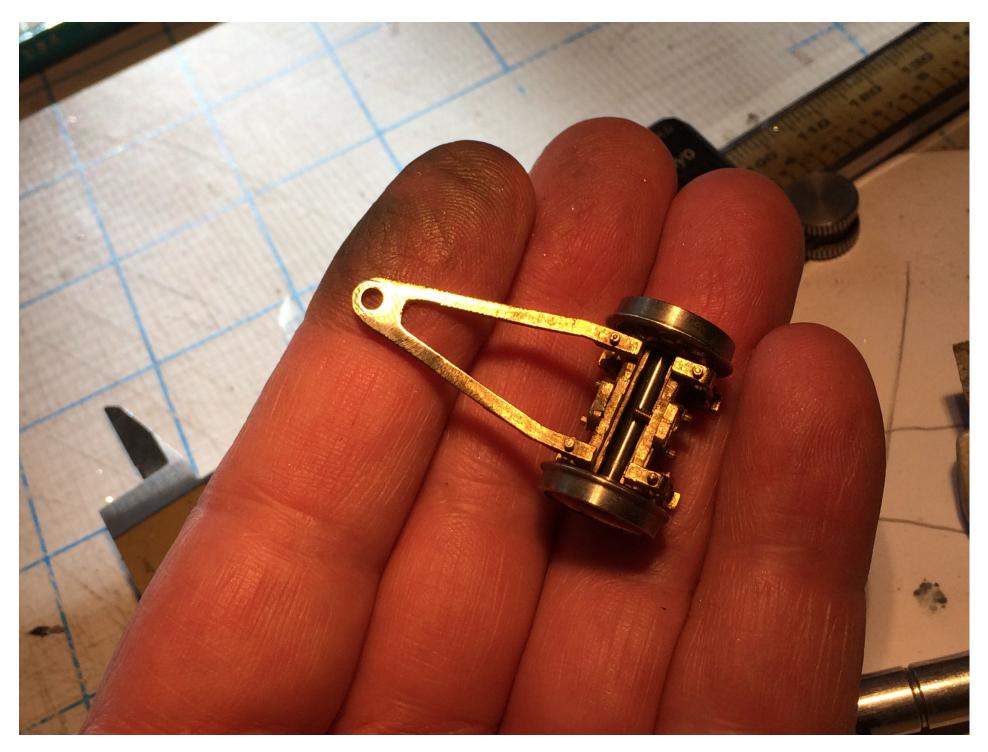


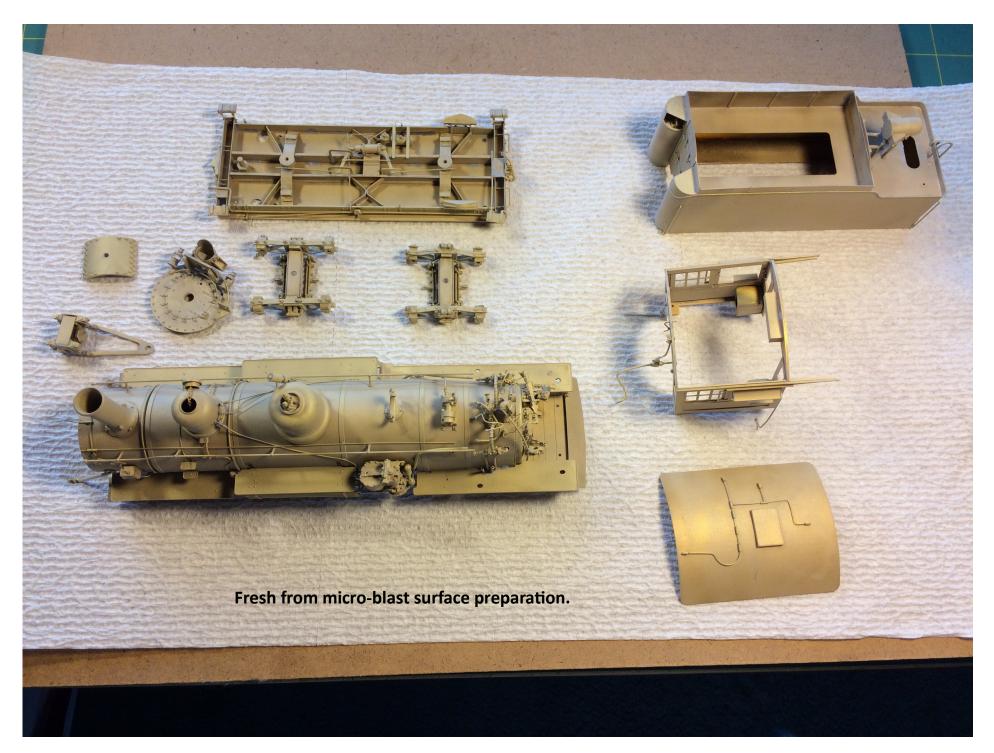
Very unique construction.

Usually, the front wall of the cab is attached to the boiler.



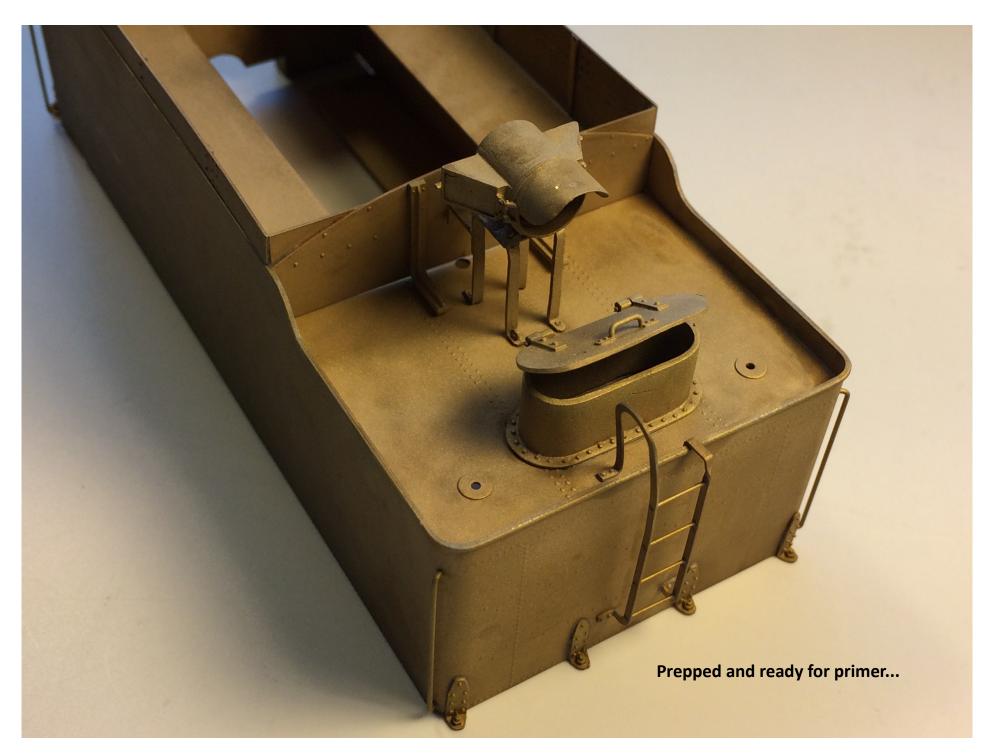




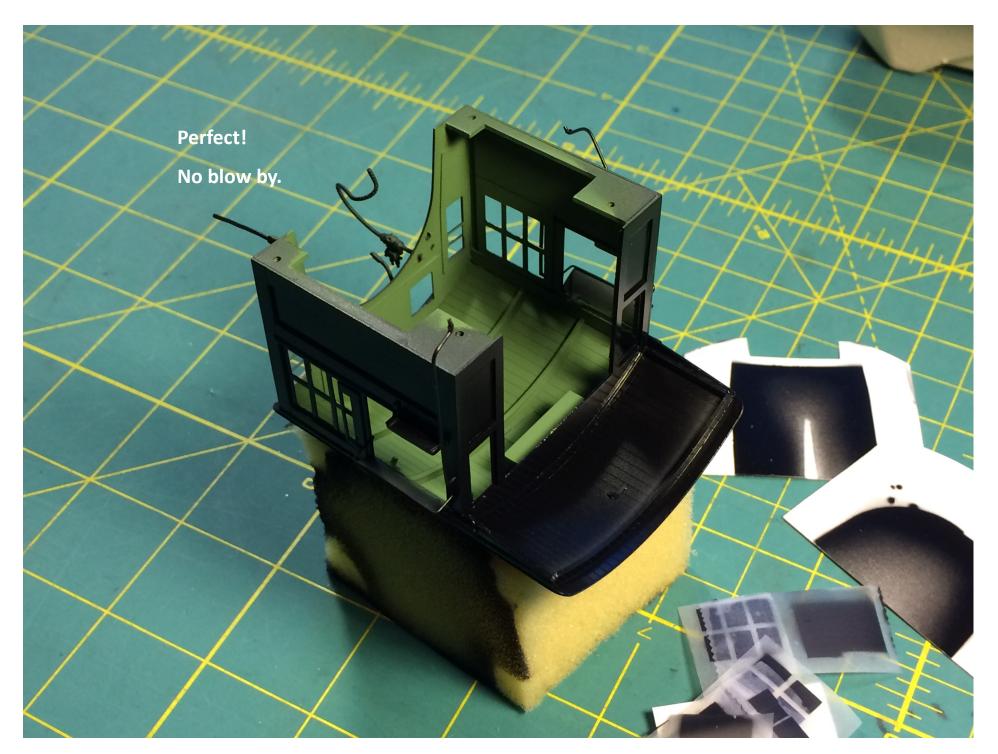




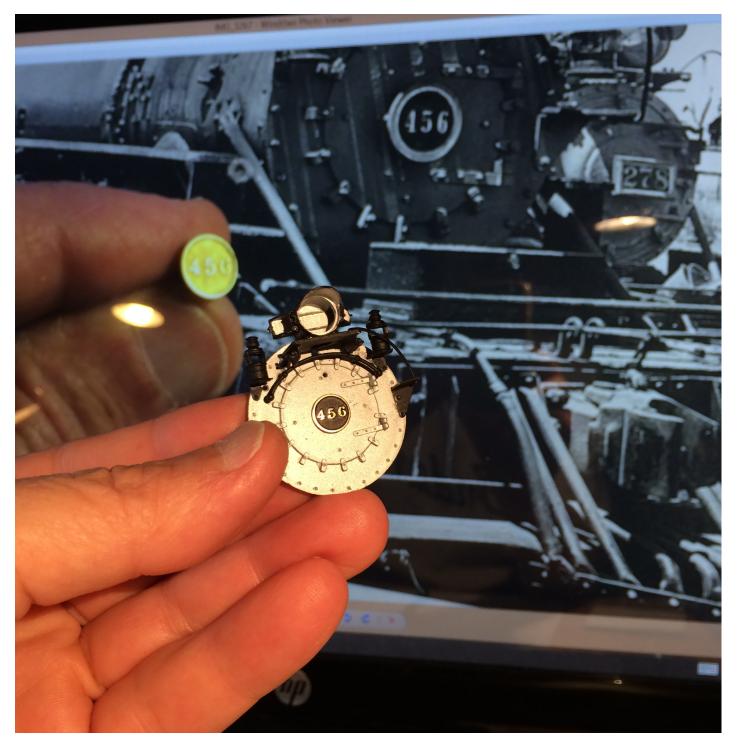


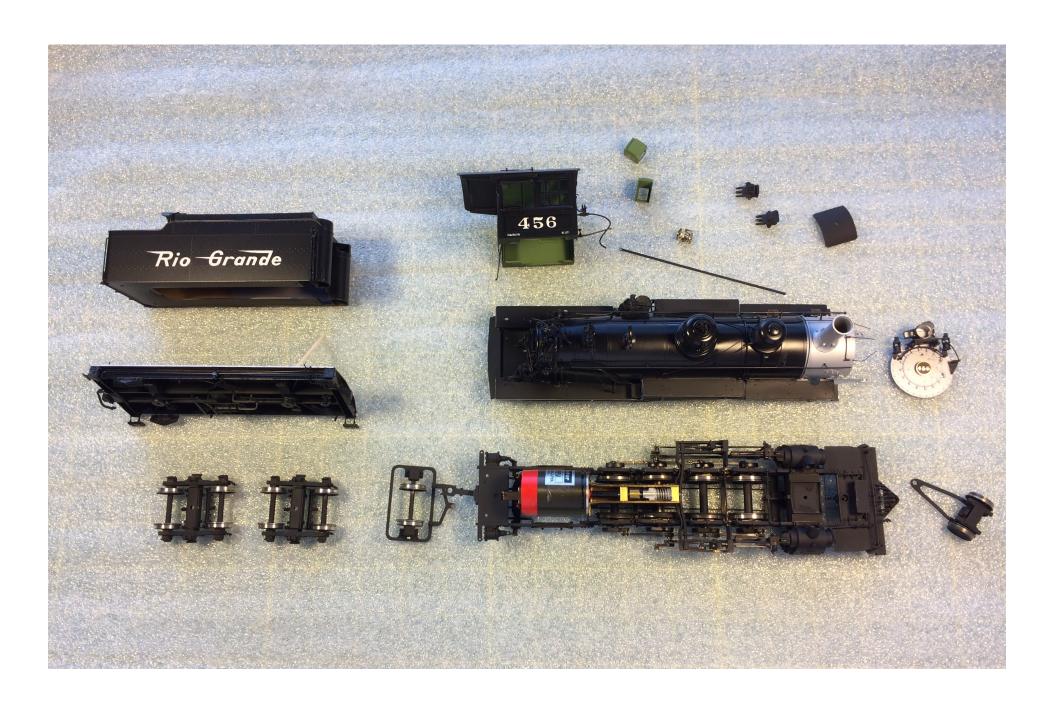
















The interaction between the equalizing lever and the Bissell pin was putting too much weight on the pilot truck. This interfered with tracking.
