Talmud Torah



- 2024 - students viewed the Tablet Tableaux exhibit
- 2025 -Talmud Torah Bat Mitzvah girls and The Montreal Shira Choir participated in a Tablet Tableaux art workshop for JDAIM (Jewish Disability Awareness & Inclusion Month) prior to their “Songs of Inclusion” performance. Together they learned about the messages revealed in parsha KiTavo via my painting and how these messages resonate with JDAIM. Everyone then created their own faces that have been integrated into an art installation comprised of 1000 faces made by members of the Jewish community entitled “Facing Challenges Together”
- 2026 - Bat Mitzvah group individual parsha paintings workshop. The paintings created by each Bat Mitzvah girl was displayed at the Bat Mitzvah ceremony and a commemorative booklet “Our Courageous Hearts” was created showcasing both art and essay focussing on the theme of the year -courage.
- 2026 - Songs of Inclusion collaborative art installation “Our Courageous Hearts” created by Bat Mitzvah girls and members of The Montreal Shira Choir. This beautiful artwork now proudly hangs on the wall of the Shira Choir studio.
- 2026 - Yom Ha’atzmaut collaborative art project (k-grade 3) which now hangs in the Talmud Torah lobby.



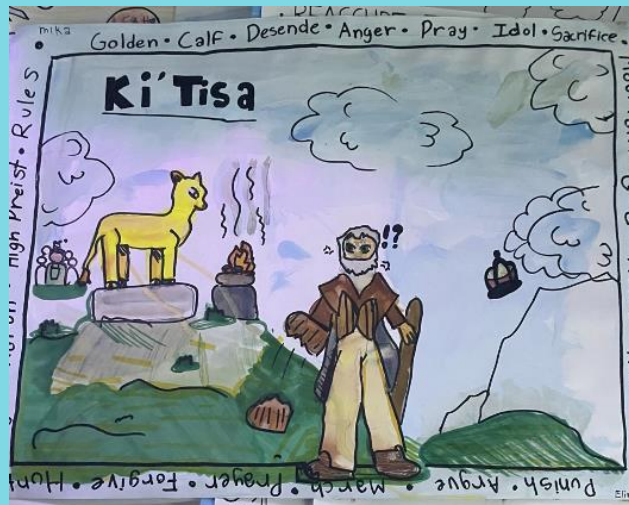
Herzlih

- 2024- Students viewed the Tablet Tableaux exhibit.
- 2025 - Herzlih students participated in JDAIM workshop – Facing Challenges Together
- 2024-2026 - After visiting the Tablet Tableaux exhibit in 2024, students created their own parsha renditions based off the exhibit. This initiative has grown every year since its inception into a program entitled “Parsha Perspectives”. This four-part interactive workshop is comprised of:
 - Part 1- Students viewing selected works from the exhibit where content and artistic representation are discussed..
 - Part 2- Students are assigned their parsha and begin their artistic journey researching and designing.
 - Part 3- Creation of multimedia parsha painting.
 - Part 4- Essay & Vernissage. Students presented their paintings in sequence (summary of parsha, explanation of painting, takeaway for today). The result was an incredible “Living Torah” created by Herzlih grade 7 students 2026.

JDAIM

(Jewish Disability Awareness Inclusion Month)

- 2025 - Part 1 of initiative - FederationCJA connected me with JDAIM partners where I conducted workshops. I presented my KiTavo painting and via the painting participants learned about the messages revealed in this parsha and how these messages resonate with JDAIM. All participants then created their own faces in solidarity.
- 2026 - I integrated the 1000 faces made by members of the Jewish community from the 2025 workshops into an art installation entitled “Facing Challenges Together”
- 2026 – “The Story Behind the Faces” vernissage of my multimedia artwork entitled “Facing Challenges Together” where I presented the story behind some of the faces collected, and then gave an artistic description of the painting, colours and symbolism embedded in the artwork.



BJEC (Bronfman Jewish Education Centre)

- 2025-I ran a JDAIM art workshop entitled “Facing Challenges Together” for grade 4 students from Montreal Jewish Day schools at FCJA’s Gelber Conference Centre. The faces created by these students have been integrated into a multi-media painting and were part of the presentation “The Story Behind the Faces”
- 2025/26-Creation of a five-part mini-series Tablet Tableaux film featuring all 54 paintings. Each segment is 12-15 minutes. BJEC will distribute the film to people up to the age of 25, and Sheila (Tablet Tableaux) will show the film to those 25+



Cummings Centre



Coming fall 2026 to the Cummings Centre is a pilot project

“Parsha Perspectives – Senior Edition”

This interactive course is comprised of:

- Viewing of BJEC film and then selected works from the exhibit where content and artistic representation will be discussed.
- Viewing the Tablet Tableaux exhibit – private tour
- Participants will be assigned their parsha and begin their artistic journey researching and designing.
- Guest speakers TBD
- Creation of multimedia parsha painting by each participant.
- Inter-generational component – connect seniors and students (Herzliah/Talmud Torah) via their parsha artwork.
- Vernissage where students and seniors can co-present their paintings in sequence (summary of parsha, explanation of painting, takeaway for today). The result will be an incredible “Multigenerational Living Torah”

The Montreal Shira Choir

- 2022-Cantor Benlolo graciously donated his time and voice to become the musical accompaniment for the audio guide for the Tablet Tableaux exhibit, and the opening and closing of all five segments of the BJEC film.
- 2025-The choir participated in the “Facing Challenges Together” workshop with the Talmud Torah Bat Mitzvah girls and families prior to “Songs of Inclusion” performance.
- March 17, 2026 - The choir performed at the vernissage of my multimedia painting “Facing Challenges Together” comprised of 1000 faces where I presented “The Story Behind the Faces” and then gave an artistic description of the painting, colours and symbolism embedded in the artwork.
- May 2026 Cantor Benlolo sat on the panel at Herzliah as students presented their “Parsha Perspectives” paintings in sequence, creating a living Torah.
- April 14, 2026 - Songs of Inclusion collaborative artwork “Our Courageous Hearts” was donated to the Montreal Shira Choir – A Small Choir with a Big Heart. This collaborative art installation now hangs on the wall of their headquarters.
- September 2026-In the choir’s Art Therapy workshops, we will create a collaborative “Tablet Tableaux” themed art piece that will be displayed at the exhibit in September.
- TBA- dedication of this artwork.
