TABLET TABLEAUX EXHIBIT: Tablet Tableaux is a modern take on an ancient theme – the Torah at Congregation Beth Tikvah in Dollard des Ormeaux. The exhibit showcases 54 large (3 by 4) multimedia paintings, each depicting a parsha of the Torah. Each painting illustrates through vibrant imagery the stories and lessons of the Torah. An audio guide will escort visitors through the exhibit describing each painting and providing commentary that goes beyond the surface level narratives of each parsha, exploring the lessons of the Torah and their application to modern day society.

A coffee table book of the exhibit has been created so that visitors will be able to bring Tablet tableaux home with them and view it and/or listen to it (through the App) at their leisure. Tablet Tableaux is an ideal vehicle for bringing the Torah to people of all ages and backgrounds and will provide the visitor with a chance to gain a better understanding of who they are, and the roadmap that the Torah lays out for us to live a meaningful life.

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#### A SHABBAT MESSAGE FROM REVEREND AMIEL BENDER

Avraham Avinu - A Pioneer of Jewish Outreach

We read the above words in our Shacharit prayers every morning, where we are reminded that Judaism started with one person who was selected by Hashen to be the father of our faith: Avraham Avinich his is the focus of the opening verses of Parashat Lech Lecha which we read this Shabbos where Hashem promises Avram blessings and that he will make him a great nation.


