NEW TWEEN MYSTERY BOOK SERIES TACKLES TIMELY ISSUES

OCTOBER 10, 2017 – Author Susan LeRoy announces the release of the first book in the Meivy Diaz Mystery series, a collection written for 9- to 13-year-olds that addresses timely cultural and political topics while teaching empathy.

“The Tale of the Locker Thief” follows Meivy as she navigates life as a young Hispanic, a new school, family matters, and a page-turning mystery. Among the issues Meivy encounters in the book is illegal immigration.

“There has never been a better time to introduce a strong, independent junior sleuth of Hispanic descent to young readers,” LeRoy says.

LeRoy’s diverse group of characters teaches acceptance, kindness and compassion. She was inspired by her English language students in the Family Literacy program in Danbury, Connecticut, many of them Hispanic.

“The group was made up of young women around the age of 17,” LeRoy says. “They all had such a strong desire to finish their education and to better their lives. I knew I had to bring their legacy to life in some way.”
