

Dynasty Fundraising 2024-2025

We will do 2 fundraisers this season as a team to raise funds for coaches travel to AAU Midwest Regionals and purchase equipment. All team gymnasts will be required to participate in order to help the team reach their goal.

Team Fundraisers

- Cinnamon Rolls

We will collect pre-orders for cinnamon rolls October 15th-November 15th. Orders can be taken for both half dozen or full dozen orders and can be made hot and ready, or freezer ready. We will meet on November 16th to make the cinnamon rolls, gymnasts will be separated into 2 shifts. Morning shift will make the dough and start preparing orders, afternoon shift will finish baking and preparing orders.

- Fireworks Stand

We will run a fireworks stand next summer to raise funds for equipment. We will have the gymnasts work an equal number of shifts to help setup, sell and tear down. All active Dynasty members will receive a discount for any purchases made at our stand.

Optional Fundraisers

Optional fundraisers will be offered to help families offset the cost of competitive expenses. Funds raised during these fundraisers can go towards meet entry fees and team uniforms. These fundraisers will only be possible if we have enough participation from team families.

- World's Finest Chocolate

Gymnasts will start with 1 box of chocolate bars, once they have sold all of their bars they can receive another box. For each box sold gymnasts will profit \$24.

- Concession Stand/Baked Goods Stand/Car Wash

If we have enough participation interest, we will run concession stands during local sporting events and community events. Profits will be split by how many shifts each individual gymnast/family helps with. Possible concession stand opportunities include Bethel college, farmers market, fairs/community events and Hamm auction in Pratt. We will potentially hold a car wash in Pratt as well.

- Garage Sale

We will hold a garage sale at the gym next summer during the Newton citywide garage sale event. Profits will be split both by items brought in and shifts worked.
