Dear Bethlehem family,

I recently found myself jumping out of bed in the morning in hopes of

seeing my dog Ella's favorite dog friend on our morning walk. I really enjoy seeing her play, and that is a recent thing because Ella used to cower behind me with her tail between her legs when she had the opportunity to play. But she has made a few friends in the neighborhood, and it's amazing how that morning play date with her friends has changed her confidence. Of course, I soon realized that I was living a little too much through my dog's fun, and that I might need a little more joy in my own life! And maybe I

am not alone with the limitations that a long-term pandemic has placed on the ways that we enjoy life.

How do we get that back? I wonder, what does the bible say about joy and happiness?

Jesus said, I have taught you these things (to remain in God's love and follow his ways) that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete. John 14

Joy is a central message of Jesus, from the announcement of the angel, "You will have joy and gladness, and many will rejoice at his birth," to the confirmation of John in the Elizabeth's womb, "For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leaped for joy." Jesus, himself, taught about joy in the parables of the lost sheep, lost coin, and prodigal son; all found in joy.

The common thread in the teaching of Jesus is that joy is not found in outside appearances or success, in victory or fame, but in relationship with God and each other. Biblical joy, and maybe joy in our lives today, is found in healing and forgiveness, new starts, new birth, and ultimately, in new life. And as Jesus was "God with us," our joy is also tied to being physically present with each other. That is



one of the wounds of the pandemic that we need God to heal. The Word promises that God will.

The old spiritual lyric, "The devil can't steal your joy," is biblical. Jesus speaking of his death said, "*I will go away, but I will return, and you will rejoice. Then, no one can take away your joy. "John 16:22.*

My joy was revived at the Trunk or Treat as I saw so many people going all out decorating trunks to give the children a little gift of joy. We even had a trunk with live chickens! And then there was the simple joy of seeing Ella bring happiness to the children, and just walking around connecting with everyone. It was such a joy! Thanks to all who participated, and to all you give and do to continue being a church physically present to God and to each other.

May we continue to be creative in finding safe ways to be together again, worshiping God, and connecting with each other in the joy that Jesus intended for us.
