Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ at Bethlehem Lutheran.

Last month I shared why a baptized Catholic like me

had joined a Lutheran Church. The short answer was this, "It was the grace." As I had heard preached at Good Shepherd Lutheran in Naperville, "There is no sin Christ won't forgive and even forget, no brokenness he can't heal, no distance he won't come for us, no injustice he won't make right, no suffering he wouldn't endure even unto death on a cross." That was good enough for me, I signed up for the next new member class.

This month, I want to go back a little further and remember how I got back to church because there was a period of my life, about 2 years, when I didn't attend. Grief and doubt dominated my spirituality then; it was a tough time. I wasn't even sure if I believed in God, even though I had grown up in a very religious family. Today, I so appreciate today

the faith that was passed on to me by my parents and grandparents. At that time, I wasn't there.

So, what happened? Well, it's not a very dramatic story. A friend told me that she really enjoyed the church that she was attending and invited me. "Some friends and I are going this Sunday. Would you like to go with us?" I don't know if I agreed to try it the first time that she invited me, or if it took a few invitations. But that was really it. I was invited. Willow Creek was my church home for the next 6 years.

Evangelism (or reaching others for Christ) is scary for some of us and just downright distasteful for others, conjuring up thoughts of strangers knocking on doors with pamphlets detailing the urgency of a personal choice between heaven and hell. Or then there's the guy on TV with a lot of promises, the last of which sticks in your mind. "If you send a generous donation to the address on the screen, God will bless you many times over."

But my experience was not like that at all. A friend cared enough to invite me along to her church. And for that I will be eternally grateful. Next question: What difference does it make in my life that I'm a Christian? Well that's another letter for another day.

God is always inviting. Jesus turned to 2 disciples who were following him and asked, "What are you looking for?" "Rabbi", they said, "where are you

staying?" He said to them, "Come and see." John, Chapter 1.

SUMMARY OF BETHLEHEM LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

January 8, 2018

December income was excellent with contributions of \$20,715.25 which was \$5,153 over budget. Total income was \$23,354.44 which was \$6,460 over budget. These overages enabled making a payment of \$4,345.98 toward our commercial insurance for 2018 which helped lower our expenses in the 2018 budget by that amount. Our general offering fund ended the year at an even zero.

Pastor Book reported that the posada was an enormous success with over 125 in attendance including several CDC families. The study book, *Unbinding the Gospel*, will be the framework/format for Wednesday evening Lenten services. Also, there has been on inquiry regarding new membership.

The proposed 2018 budget was approved, as was the strategic committee's presentation of a Strategic Plan. Both of these items as well as the Church Constitution update will be presented at the annual meeting for congregational approval. All members should have received, either by regular mail or email, copies of the Strategic Plan as well as the proposed Constitution update prior to the annual meeting.

Campbell's Soup Labels & V8 juice bottle caps are discontinued

Mosaic (Bethphage) at Axtell

I spoke with the Community Relations Manager at Mosaic (Bethphage) at Axtell this past week to get a complete update on what they still accept in the way of labels, bottle caps, and box tops. Sadly, neither Campbell's soup labels nor V8 Juice bottle caps can be accepted.

Soup labels cannot be redeemed because Campbell's Soups has discontinued their due to declining participation and increasing costs. Sadly, it has reached the point where there was no choice but to make the very difficult decision to wind down the program.

Regarding V8 juice bottle caps, Mosaic is no longer accepting them as the cost of mailing or shipping them for redemption is greater than the value gotten in redemption.

Here is some general information about what Mosaic/Bethphage can accept.


