Hey Bethlehem, how are you?

I mean you, altogether, how's life treating you these days? Pretty well for

one nearing 150 years of age; showing some longevity that's super-human.

Paul reminds us that we are altogether, somebody, a living breathing, more than super-human someone, the body of Christ. Here at Bethlehem, you are each one not only vital to this body, but to each other and to God.

... ⁵ so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. Romans 12

Together we are somebody, and not just anybody, Christ! How is that possible? That miracle is possible through the Holy Spirit given to each of us in baptism. In some way, nothing short of a miracle, this body that we call Bethlehem, has exactly what it needs to come together as Christ. Though we are each different as individuals, just like the body has many different parts, come together as more than the sum of our parts, we become something holy.

Paul also describes the special part that each member plays in the vitality of the body.

¹⁶ And if the ear should say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," it would not for that reason stop being part of the body. ¹⁷ If the whole body were an eye, where would the sense of hearing be? If the whole body were an ear, where would the sense of smell be? ¹⁸ But in fact God has placed the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be. 1 Corinthians 12.

Each of you has an invaluable function in this body, and that's true whether you are 3 or 93; whether you were baptized and confirmed at Bethlehem or you are the newest member; whether we have seen you at every Sunday service, or health or something else has kept you away lately. You mean something to us;

together we are something special, somebody special, the body of Christ.

All this works, not because we are the same, but because we are different. We have different gifts given to us by the Holy Spirit for use in the body.

⁶ We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your^[a] faith; ⁷ if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; ⁸ if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead, ^[b] do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully. Romans 12

And the amazing thing about those gifts, is that is that they are so much fun to share. So, if you have the gift of teaching, and a passion for children, you probably love teaching Sunday School. But for others, it would be a chore. If you have the gift of helping, and Holy Communion is important to you, you might be especially filled up and blessed by serving on the Altar Guild, a team who prepares the table for communion. Someone without that gift may be willing to do it sacrificially because they love the church, but they might not experience the same joy over time. Sometimes we are called to give sacrificially; but when the body is functioning best, all are sharing in their area of giftedness. And the joy is contagious. It's like everyone is bringing their favorite dish to the party and all the food coordinates for an unbelievable feast.

Do you know your areas of giftedness? These are the areas where you feel the greatest sense of purpose and meaning in the body. We all have them according to the bible. We have set July this year as a time to explore our spiritual gifts. We will offer a preaching series from July 21 until August 4th, and during that time, you will have the opportunity to take a gifts inventory. Even if you know your spiritual gift(s), maybe you'll discover another. God is always doing a new thing. In the meantime, enjoy your summer. See you as we gather, or we'll know your presence in Spirit. Be well.
