Dear Bethlehem family,

Being one who prefers to live one day at a time, recently turning 60 caught

me off guard. I even jokingly repeated my age mantra to the congregation, not too many days before the milestone. "I realize now that I've lived half my life." Let's see 60 + 60 = 120. Ok. Mental update needed.

I even had my life flash before my eyes the day before my birthday, and I thought that meant it was over. 
How do you get through such mental conundrums? 
King David the psalmist prays, "Rescue me, O my God from the grasp of fill in the blank. For you O Lord, are my hope, I have trusted in you from my childhood. Psalm 71:5

That passage holds special meaning to my sister Kathy and I, as she gifted me with a beautiful painting many years ago that featured this very verse. The word HOPE, she painted in all caps. She had grown up with me as big sister, I have 13 years on her, being one of those who she credits with passing on the faith to her – especially with the reading of the bible. Our relationship later would go through painful years, especially for her, after I left home and became too self-focused to remember the preciousness of my little sister. The painting came after amends, forgiveness and reconciliation in our relationship. In it, the word of God, *my HOPE*, emerges from the beautifully ambiguous sunset, or sunrise, of one day.

Dorothy Day, tireless and passionate defender of the hopeless and homeless in New York city, penned this about her daily practice of faith. "My strength returns to me with my cup of coffee and the reading of the psalms." So, I read on with King David and Psalm 71:

<sup>9</sup>"Do not cast me off in the time of old age; do not forsake me when my strength is spent." And later, <sup>15</sup>"I will hope continually, and will praise you yet more and more. <sup>17</sup>O God, from my youth you have taught me, and I still proclaim your wondrous deeds. <sup>18</sup>So even to old age and gray hairs (yup), O God, do not forsake me, until I proclaim your might to all the generations to come.

None of us knows how many days we have on this earth to sing God's praises and to pass along the faith. Every day is precious, and purpose filled, no matter our age. I've been blessed by those from 9 days to 99 years old. People are even more precious than the number of days. I am grateful for relationships past and present, including the congregation at Bethlehem and the opportunity to serve here. Mental update complete. Dorothy Day was right, just give me a cup of coffee and the Psalms. For you O Lord are my hope. I have trusted you from my childhood. Peace and blessings to you and your loved ones in this one day.

May 13, 2019

April and May have flown by with the weather changing daily, leaving us wondering whether we will have snow, floods, or sunshine. Hopefully, June brings the warm weather to Bethlehem!

The fire code repairs are progressing nicely with only minor delays or additional costs so far.

At the request of the Worship/ Learning/ Witness Committees, the council discussed the possibility of any modifications or changes to the worship schedule. The committees have proposed options including changing the worship times to 9, 10, 11 with 10 being Coffee Hour, Sunday School, Youth Group, Small Groups, or individual forums. The committees asked if the council could discuss these options & how that would/ could simplify our Sunday morning and what challenges may remain or even be created. During the council meeting, we all agreed that there are pros and cons, and this should be an ongoing discussion with the congregation. Possibly focus on growing/developing the 10:30 service rather than change the times. We discussed participation concerns and how the revised times could impact our members. We invite the congregation to share any thoughts, preferences, and ideas regarding this topic. We have also agreed to host our annual Church picnic on August 6, 2019, at 6 p.m.- 8 p.m. again this year in conjunction with National Night Out. Here is additional information provided by the Elgin Police Department, and further details for the BLC picnic will be provided as the plans progress. Please mark your calendars and plan to join us on August 6th rain or shine!

National Night Out is Tuesday, August 6 6-pm Contact your neighbors and mark your calendars for the 35th Annual National Night Out crime prevention celebration! National Night Out (NNO) is an excellent opportunity to build neighborhood unity and strengthen police-community partnerships. It is also a chance to send a message to criminals, letting them know neighborhoods are organized and fighting back. It's a chance for neighbors to get to know each

other and celebrate community efforts to fight crime. If you are hosting a party this year, the hours are 6-8 p.m. You and your neighbors can plan the party in any form you wish. If you register, your party will be visited by the city, including a police officer, the Fire Department, a city dignitary and if possible, a costumed mascot.
