Dear Bethlehem,

We gathered today for a Congregational Breakfast and Conversation, and

many great ideas were shared about how Bethlehem may grow as church. It was a good conversation with folks who care very deeply about their church. Who might those new people be, and where would they come from was one very good question asked.

In the following passage from Mark 5, two very different people are drawn to Jesus. The first is Jairus.

²² Then one of the leaders of the synagogue, named Jairus, came and, when he saw him, fell at his

feet ²³ and pleaded with him repeatedly, "My little daughter is at the point of death. Come and lay your hands on her, so that she may be made well and live. Jesus followed him.

Jairus was a leader of the synagogue, well off, connected, respected, one who would normally send someone else to ask a favor of Jesus. He comes himself, and he throws himself at Jesus' feet. All was not well; he was in desperate need.

The second is an unnamed woman.

²⁵ Now there was a woman who had been suffering from a flow of blood for twelve years. ²⁶ She had endured much under many physicians and had spent all that she had, and she was no better but rather grew worse. ²⁷ She had heard about Jesus and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak,

She was considered unclean from her bleeding disorder, and not allowed to approach Jesus. She was a woman who had exhausted all options and resources. She too seems to have desperate need.

One well off and connected, the other poor, isolated and herself sick. She had no one to ask for her. What do they have in common that draws them to Jesus – need. They were both far from having it all together. Jesus responds compassionately to both, healing Jairus' daughter and the woman.

This is a great reading for those who don't have it all together, those who know their own vulnerability. All the characters have needs. I wonder if this is important for us to consider in thinking about Bethlehem's growth.

If we want people to feel comfortable needing Jesus, we might be willing to admit that we do too. So, if you're someone who doesn't always have it all together, you might be perfect to welcome a visitor!

This is not easy, allowing others to see our mistakes and our need for help. But the hope is that in Christ, we can be the kind of place where we can be known and loved for who we are, even when we don't have it all together, even when mistakes are obvious, even when needs are great. Jesus responds with whatever is needed: healing, compassion, grace, love. That makes for a very welcoming church. Thanks for being that kind of church Bethlehem.
